October 10th 1857

I John Daugherty of the County

& State aforesaid being of sound mind and
disposing memory and being in perfect health
but knowing that I have some relation to die &
believe I should while in good health dispose
of my property & ready effects as seem best to me
among my family & in consequence of a will I do
make and ordain this my last Will and Testament
& for the faithful carrying out of the same I do
appoint my three Sons Samuel W. Daugherty, Landon
W. Daugherty & Silas A. Daugherty as my executors
first after my funeral expenses are paid and all
my just debts paid - Will and bequeath to my
wife Sarah Daugherty all the lands I now in
possession which is my home tract & all the lands
I now own - with all the negroes I may own at
the time of my death to stay on the plantation and
to be her exclusive property during her natural
life or widowhood except what negroes I may after
dispossession of & wish my executors to have an over-
sight of the negroes & see that they are suitable
to belet out to her if any of them - disobeys and
becomes refractory to her out the negroes so
disobeying & the master put it in trust for the use
of my family - Also wish my executors to see that
everything goes on to the best interest of all
concerned my wife next to be settled but to have a
life or comfortable & easy as she may wish or desire.
Also will and bequeath to youngest son Hughey
Johnston my home plantation at the death of his
mother to his own wife & stepson use his & his assigns
for ever my daughter Margaret Daugherty to have
a life time interest in the above named lands
provided she leave marriage sufficient to support
her & what negroes she may have all working to gather
on her a support - Also give my son Hughey & at my death
a negro woman Haly the youngest child less than
increas from this time.

I bequeath to my three sons Samuel & Landon W. & Silas A.
Daugherty - their negroes Barnes - Andrew - & Randall
they to take them at valuation by disinterested men
of judgment at the time of my death & my executors to sell

all or divide what lands I have except what shall be equally
 given to my youngest Son Hughes together with all the property
 of every description that may be on my plantation at my death with
 what will be sufficient for the support of my wife and family
 & expenses that I wish left with her & horses & Stock to carry on her
 farming business & with the proceeds of the above three negroes &
 the amount of the Sales of the above named property and what
 notes & debts may be due me or in hand I wish divided
 between the following Children viz.
 I wish my Daughter Polly Lewis to have a thousand & Fifty
 Hairs one thousand & dollars, Aaron Hyatt and Margaret
 Daugherty each to have a thousand dollars - each of the above
 named four Daughters to deduct from their amount
 of the thousand dollars, what they have been before hand
 Polly Lewis has one hundred ninety dollars to be struck from her
 thousand without interest - Fifty Hairs has one hundred five
 hundred & twenty five dollars to be taken from her part in
 the same way - Aaron Hyatt has one hundred eighty seven &
 Margaret has one hundred four hundred & twenty dollars,
 in no case interest to be added -
 I also wish each of my Son, Lemuel, Lawson & Silas
 to be made up to them a thousand dollars with what
 they have hitherto received - Lemuel has been
 left one hundred & seven dollars - Lawson has the end
 two hundred & forty dollars, & Silas has the end twelve
 hundred & seventy two dollars no interest to be charged
 & after each of the above named Polly, Fifty, Aaron & each
 of the above named Polly, Fifty, Aaron & Margaret Lemuel
 & Silas & Lawson is made equal to a thousand dollars,
 then what is left of the Sale of the above named
 property and value at least of \$1000 there remain to
 notes & debts as above named shall be equally
 divided between the aforesaid Polly, Fifty, Aaron
 Margaret, Lemuel, Lawson & Silas - namely what
 I leave to my Daughter Polly Lewis I leave to my
 Son Lemuel Daugherty in trust for her use
 to School & Raise her Children and Support
 her & Children & Polly Lewis never to have any
 advantage therefrom - I also leave to my grand son
 Silas Lewis a small tract of land lying in the
 County number of acres not measured - Said tract I
 bought from W Lewis which I wish my Executor to
 let back to until he comes to be of lawful age
 and at the death of my wife or when my son John
 Hyatt becomes of age I wish my Executor to sell
 all the property & pay my debts what I owe

my just debts paid - will and bequeath to my
wife Sarah Daugherty all the lands I now in
possession which is my home tract & all the lands
I now having - with all the negroes I may own at
the time of my death to stay on the plantation and
to be her exclusive property during her natural
life or widowhood except what negroes she might
dispose of & wish my executors to have an over-
sight of the negroes I see that they are entitled
& obedient to her if any of them - disabled and
becomes refractory to hire out the negroes so
disobedient & the master put it in trust for the use
of her family - also wish my executors to see that
everything goes on to the best interest of all
concerned my wife seat to be stabled but to have it
live as comfortable & easy as she may wish or desire.
I also will and bequeath to youngest son Hughey
Johnston my home plantation at the death of his
mother to his own self & after use his heirs & assigns
for ever my daughter Margaret Daugherty to have
a life time interest in the above named lands
provided she now marry sufficient to support
her & what negroes she may have all working to gether
make a support - also give my son Hughey & at my death
a negro woman Haly the youngest child bearing their

I bequeath these son Leman & Johnson W & Silas W.
Daugherty - three negroes - James - Andrew - & Roselle

I wish my Daughter Polly Lemire to have a thousand and fifty dollars one thousand dollars Darius Hoyt and Margaret Daugherty each to have a thousand dollars - each of the above named four Daughters to deduct from their amount of the thousand dollars what they have been before record. Polly Lemire has one hundred ninety dollars to be struck from her thousand without interest - Darius Hoyt has one hundred six hundred & twenty five dollars to be taken from his part in the same way - Darius Hoyt has one hundred eighty seven & Margaret has one hundred four hundred and twenty dollars in no case interest to be added -

Also wish each of my Sons Lemuel Lawson & Silas to be made up to them a thousand dollars with what they have been before record - Lemuel has one hundred one hundred & twenty five dollars - Lawson has one hundred two hundred & forty dollars & Silas has one hundred twelve hundred & seventy two dollars no interest to be charged & after each of the above named Polly - Darius - Darius - each of the above named Polly - Darius - Darius - & Margaret Lemuel & Silas & Lawson is made equal to a thousand dollars, then what is left of the sale of the above named property and valuatees of \$^d three negroes & notes & debts as above named shall be equally divided between the aforesaid Polly - Darius - Darius - Margaret - Lemuel - Lawson - & Silas - until the life what I leave to my Daughter Polly Lemire I leave to my Son Lemuel Daugherty in trust for her use to School & Raise her Children and Support her & Children & Polly Lemire never to have any advantage therefrom - I also leave to my grand son Silas Lemire a small tract of land lying in ~~the~~ County number of acres not particularized - said tract I bought from W Lemire which I wish my Executor to let sink to until he comes to be of lawful age and at the death of my wife or when my son Silas Johnston becomes of age I wish my Executor to sell all the property & negroes except what I have

expressly named and said property when sold
Interest to be equally divided between my three sons
Lemuel - Lawson W. & Lila, I do my four daughters, Polly
Daisy Harris, Frances Hyatt & Margaret or if they
choose best to value the negro & keep them among
them. Polly Linton part to be in trust as before
named my son Hugley Johnson to have a good
Horse & Saddle & Bridle & to have five hundred dollars
out of the sales of the land named property & to
have sufficient schooling out of what is made
of the farm & I will bequeath to my Daughter Sarah
Platt an equal share with my other daughters &
the above named Land, provided she ~~ever~~ ever has
a child & if she never has one not to receive any
part as I have hitherto given her a likely Negro
girl Horriet value at the time at from hundred
dollar & besides ninety two dollars in other property
which I think is sufficient if she never has an heir.
