The Last Will & Testament of John Morrison Esq.

In the name of God Amen

John Morrison being of the County of Buncombe and State of North Carolina being sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be God on this 13th day of January 1834 make and publish my last will and testament in manner following That is to say First I give and bequeath unto Elizabeth my beloved wife the tract of land on which I now live with the improvements now on it from the Black-oak corner on the Rutherford side of the Ridge running a west to the bridge-tree Branch thence up said Branch to the Rutherford line I give her this land during her lifetime after her death I will said land to my son Jepsey and his heirs to have the property privilege of working said land is to support his mother and Elizabeth and Rachel Mary and Rachel are to live their Mother while they live single Secondly I give my wife one bed and furniture and one mare Saddle and bridle said mare is called Trim ³/₄ I give my wife three cows and the cooking Utensils and two sheep and what hogs I have is to be for the use of my wife and daughters the tables and chairs to be for the use of the family I also give my wife one chest I also give my wife what corn and rufnes I have on hand for the support of the stock I give my Charley horse to my daughter and my son Isaac I give my two year old horse to my son Daniel I give my wagon to my son William and Jepsey and John and my wife I give to my son John a tract of land beginning at the fork of the Boode-tree Branch thence along Merrell's line to the Chestnut corner thence a western course to Shelton's line thence along Shelton's line North 130 poles I leave all my plantation tools for the use of the farm I give my son John my young horse by the name of Flay my son John is to live with his mother until he comes of age or marries I give my daughter Margaret one two year old hufes I give my daughter Agnes two oldest daughters Cynth Maxwell and Elizabeth Maxwell one young hufes each I give to my son William one cow and calf I give to my three daughters that are now single the beds and furniture that they claim And I hereby make and appoint my attorney friend Joseph Lammie Executor of this my last will and testament In witness whereof I the said John Morrison have to this my last will and testament set my hand and seal the day and year above written Signed Sealed Published and Declared by the said John Morrison the Testator as his last will and testament in the presence of us who are present at the time of signing and sealing thereof

1st That all my just debts be punctually paid out of my Estate by sale or otherwise

2^d I will and bequeath to my dear wife Jane my lands and tenements, stock of every description the house hold and kitchen furniture and all the farming tools during her widowhood except so much as will defray my just debts should she again marry then she is to have ~~and off her~~ as her portion out of the above named one bed and its furniture one wheel of cords all the pot ware all the dinner ware, one cow and calf, one horse beast worth六十 dollars and one good saddle and bridle a Chest and all her wearing apparel &

3^d I will that my faithful Slave Ephraim be set free at my death. All the lands and property to be sold after my wifes marriage except those items named above for her portion and the money equally divided among all my children Ephraim to be at liberty to choose his own Guardian but under the guardianship of my Exec't
