

John Pentlands Will.

In the name of God Amen! I John Pentland of the County of Brunswick and State of North Carolina being sick and afflicted in body, thought of sound mind and disposing mind, and seeing to mind the mutability of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die, do make and ratify this my last Will and Testament.

First I commend my soul to Almighty God that gave it and my body to be buried in a Christian manner at the discretion of my Executors. And as to my worldly goods with which God has blessed me I bequeath in the following manner.

Item First, I direct that all my just debts be paid by my Executors. I appoint my beloved wife Priscilla Pentland, Executor of this my last Will and Testament.

Item Second, after my just debts are paid I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Priscilla during her natural life, all my real and personal estate and after her death the remaining property be divided equally among my children.

In testimony whereof, I have set my hand and seal, this 25th day of August, 1800.
