

The last will and testament of Edward Burlison

I know all men by these presents, that I, Edward Burlison, of the County of Buncombe, and Commonwealth of North Carolina, being sick of body, but of perfect mind and memory, and calling to mind the mortality of the body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make this, and no other my last will and testament, viz; first, and personally, to give my soul into the hands of the Almighty God, that gave it to me, and my body to the earth, from whence it came, to be buried in a decent form after the directions of my Executors hereinafter named, not doubting but I shall receive the same at the general resurrection by the same Almighty power, and as touching such worldly goods or estate, wherewithal it hath pleased God to bless me with, I give and dispose of in the manner and form following, viz; First, I give and bequeath unto my present and beloved wife Poly Burlison and her heirs, all of the Rock-Kissick tract of land from John Greenwood's Land, up to the tract of land that my son Isaac Burlison lately lived on, and also, I give them one hundred dollars, to be paid out of the balance of my property, and all the household and kitchen furniture, and one year's provisions, to be laid out by two disinterested men on the day of sale, for her and all the family, and stock that remains unto her. Secondly, It is my will and desire, that all the remainder of my real and personal estate be sold on a credit of twelve months, and after paying all of my just debts, out of the money, then the remainder to be equally divided between my first wife's children, viz: Margaret Coats, Poly Tillingsham, Isaac Burlison, Rebecca Carter, E. W. Burlison, Jane Williams Jackson Burlison, Washington Burlison, Anderson Burlison and Elizabeth Burlison, & also, I hereby ordain, my worthy friends, and sons-in-law, Gabriel L. Coats, and Edward Carter, Executors of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof, I, the said Edward Burlison have set my hand and seal, this the sixteenth day of January one thousand eight hundred and forty-one.

In the name of God, amen, I, John Whitaker, Senior, of the County of Buncombe, and State of North Carolina, (farmer) being sick and weak in body, but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be given unto God, calling unto mind, the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament, that is to say, principally, and first of all, I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God, that gave it, and my body, I recommend to the earth to be decent Christian burial, at the direction of my Executors, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same, as given by the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly estate, wherewithal it has pleased God to bless me in this life, I give, demise, and dispose of in the following manner and form: First, I give and bequeath to Charity, my beloved wife, all the property that I possess during her life; also, I give to my beloved son, John, my land and working tools, and the household furniture, I want equally divided among my three daughters, also, wish my son, John, likewise to constitute, make and ordain the sole Executor of this my last will and testament. In witness, hereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this March thirteenth, one thousand eight hundred and forty.
