

Will Dickit Jr

North Carolina } The last Will & Testament of John Young
 Buncombe County } In the name of God Amen. I, John Young of the County of
 Buncombe & State of North Carolina, being in my usual health but advanced
 in age. And calling to mind the mortality of my body, do make order
 & establish this my last Will & Testament, in manner & form following,
 to wit: By items.

Item 1st I will & devise that all my just debts be paid.

Item 2nd I will and devise to my beloved wife Rosanna Young three hundred
 dollars in money two beds Bedsteads & furniture to be disposed of as she
 chooses.

Item 3rd I will devise & bequeath to my daughter Jane Porter her heirs and
 assigns forever the tract of Land on the North fork of Savannah River
 supposed to be one hundred & eighty acres lying in three tracts, purchased
 from Francis Trice by reference to which and the boundaries thereof
 will more fully appear. One copied Will now in possession of her Son-in-law
 Alexander Porter, & after the death of my wife Rosanna, one negro girl
 named Angelina & her increase should she have any.

Item 4th I will devise and bequeath to my daughter in law Rebecca Young
 Widow of my son William, her heirs and assigns during her life or
 widowhood the tract of Land on which she now lives, containing about
 two hundred & seven acres purchased by me from Lewis Wessell and at
 her death or marriage, I will devise & bequeath that the said Land be
 equally divided between Rosanna, Sarah, Jane Thomas, Martha Alta Belinda
 Samuel & Mary Young Children of my said son William Young their heirs
 & assigns forever.

Item 5th I will & bequeath to my Grandson Samuel P. Young his heirs
 & assigns one negro boy named George & a small rifle Gun.

Item 6th I will devise & bequeath to my son Thomas L. Young his heirs
 & assigns forever the tract of Land on Savannah where he now lives
 which was purchased by one of John Patton, the boundaries of which
 will more fully appear by reference to the deed of conveyance
 from said Patton to me. & one copper still now in his possession
 & a negro girl named Julia together with her increase, and all my
 Carpenter tools. I also will & bequeath to my said son T. L. Young
 during the natural life of my wife Rosanna five negroes to wit
 Lucy Spencer Lowry Angelina Charlotte. All the stock of Horses cattle
 hogs & sheep. Wagon & Cows & farming tools of every kind, Youngs
 Cold & kitchen furniture.

Item 7th I will & bequeath to my Grandson Samuel ^{Jr} Young his heirs
 & assigns, a negro boy named Dick, & my large rifle Gun.

Item 8th I will devise & bequeath to my daughter Mary M. Cammon her
 her heirs & assigns forever, the one half of the McBray tract
 of Land to be divided by, commencing ^{with} the branch on which
 McBray had a mill. ^{crossing the North} and run with
 the North line.

And then to continue the said direction as the general course of the branch to the South Line the part lying next to Fowells to belong to the said Mary. And after the death of my Wife Rosanna one negro boy named Garry.

Item 8th I will devise & bequeath to my Grandchildren Willington Pettit John Pettit Samuel P. Pettit their heirs & assigns forever. The other upper part of the McGary tract of Land joining the part given to Mary Edmonson in Item 8th & being the part of the McGary tract of Land not given to the said M. Edmonson.

Item 10th I will & bequeath to my two Grand daughters Rosanna & Martha Pettit their heirs & assigns, a negro girl named Louiza and her increase should she have any, to come into their possession after the death of my Wife.

Item 11th I will & bequeath to my Grand daughter Martha Ann Edmonson her heirs & assigns, one negro girl named Caroline & her increase if any, to come to possession of the said Martha Ann after the death of my Wife.

Item 12th I will & bequeath to my daughter Mary M. Edmonson her heirs & assigns (after the death of my Wife) a negro woman named Lucy.

Item 13th I will & bequeath (after the death of my Wife) to my daughter in law Rebecca Gony during her life or widowhood a negro girl named Charlotte. & after her death or marriage the said girl & the increase after she comes to the possession of the said Mary, to be divided among the same persons & in the same manner as the Land mentioned in item 4th of this Will directed to be divided.

Item 14th I will & desire that all the rest of my property both real & personal be sold my Executor at public sale on a credit of twelve months and the proceeds of such sales together with money and land debts due me at my death after paying my just debts and three hundred dollars bequeathed unto my Wife be divided into five equal parts, & one part to be given to my daughter Jane Porter. one part to the Children of my son William. One part to my son Thomas L. One part to Mary M. Edmonson. One part to the Children of my daughter Nancy Pettit deceased. I here by appoint Joshua Roberts my sole Executor of this my last Will & Testament.
