County of Buncombe and State of North Carolina being
of perfect mind and memory, thanks be to God, but
calling to mind the mortality of my body, and
knowing that it is appointed for all men once to
die do hereby make and ordain this and no other as
my last will and Testament in manner and form
following that is to say: first of all I desire that
my soul pass into the peaceful presence of all might
-by God, who gave it, and my body to be buried in
a decent Christian like manner burial at the
direction of my surviving friends, and as touching
the worldly estate where with it hath pleased God to
bless me in this life I give and bequeath in the follo-
-wing manner and form; First I give and bequeath
unto son, Spencer (After paying all my just
debts) the sum of Five hundred Dollars, including
the Four hundred and Twelve dollars I heretofore
advanced to him, Secondly I give and devise
to my Daughter Mary Ashworth the like sum
of Five hundred Dollars including the Two-
-hundred and Ninety Eight Dollars, advanced to
him or her hereunto, and I give and devise
unto my Daughter Susanah all my lands
where I now live including the lands conveyed
to me by Robert Pinkerton and Dampier
Sumner and her to board clothe and in every
support, her mother Elizabeth Merrill, in a quiet
and comfortable manner, for and during
the term of her natural life, said land hereby
conveyed to my Daughter Susanah to be to her
during the term of her natural life, then to
her heirs, my wife to have one good, good,
bead beaded and all necessary bed clothing,
boath for winter and summer, and shortly
after my death I desire that all my remain-
ing property, then on hand be sold by
my Executors, and as much of the proceeds
paid over to my son Spencer ~~and~~ and
Daughter Mary as will make up the
remaining part of the Five hundred,
the remaining part of the 100

proceeds to be equally divided among my three
 children, I also nominate constitute and
 appoint my son Alexander and Johnston
 Ashworth as my sole Executors of this my
 last will and Testament, hereby revoking
 disannulling and setting aside all other will
 or wills by me at any time heretofore made
 and declared, this and no other as my last
 will and Testament, in witness where
 of I have hereunto set my hand and seal
 and in the presence of, and in the presence
 of each other this the 16th day of September 1857
