That out of my household furniture
I will two beds to Miss Nellie Catton
The balance of all my property both
personal and real including all good
and monies of every description that I
may own or have when I die and the
tract of land on which I now live being
about two hundred acres and every species
of property belonging to me in this state

and give one half to each of the following

nesses I sign this as my last Will with a
desire that its provisions be complied with
this the 6th April 1884.

And J. J. R. Wells will and request
that my executor take of the proceeds
of my property a sufficiency to cover
all the burial expenses of my own
body, and also to provide
my disease wife as
