2d, I give and bequeath to my deceased husband's two sisters Five hundred Dollars each

3d, I give and bequeath to my Church at Litchfield Plains Maine two hundred Dollars,

4th, I give and bequeath to my half sister Harriet L. Grant, of Malden Massachusetts Two hundred Dollars.,

5th, I give and bequeath to my brother Samuel. Smith, all the remainder and residue of my property, after debts and the foregoing bequeaths shall have been made.

6th, I direct that my real estate be sold and reduced to money, at such suitable time as my Executors shall determine and the law requires

7th, I hereby appoint Walter S. Cushman of Asheville, the Executor of this my will. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this August twenty ninth 1895,
