

Will Docket at October Term 1849.

The last Will & Testament of Leander J. Wells Dec^d.

I, Leander J. Wells, of the County of Buncombe, & State of North Carolina, being sick and afflicted in body, tho' of sound and disposing mind, and calling to mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die, do make and ordain this my last Will & Testament.

First I commend my soul to Almighty God that gave it, and my body to be buried in a Christian manner at the Discretion of my Executors: and as to my worldly goods with which God has blessed me, I bequeath in the following manner. First I direct that all my Just debts to be paid by my Executors, and I appoint my beloved brethren S. F. Wells & R. P. Wells, Executors of this my last Will & Testament, and as the Principal part of my unsettled debts and accounts exist between myself & Peares Roberts, I direct my Executors to sell so much of my property, as may be necessary to discharge all my liabilities, with him and all other just claims. And first I direct my Executors to use an diligence to collect the debts due me, and apply the means to the extinction the debts I owe.

The balance of my Estate both real and personal I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife Mary Louisa, during her natural life and widowhood, except the Tract of Land whereon I live, the Tract that my Father gave me: That Tract I desire my Wife to have the possession & profits of, until my son Swan Franklin Wells shall arrive at the age of Twenty years, and at that time I desire the said Land, herein last mentioned, to be the right and property of my said son Swan Franklin, and that he have the possession of the same. And as to the property that may fall to my Wife by the provisions of this my Will, my desire is, that in the event of her death before marriage, that it be equally divided among my Children, and if my Wife should marry then in that event, it is my desire, that the property heretofore bequeathed to her during her natural life and widowhood be equally divided with my Wife & my Children, share & share alike.
