My will and desire is that Two hundred dollars is reserved by my executor to pay the first National Bank at Wellington Kansas if he finds that they gave me too much money by mistake or oversight on our last settlement.

But if on investigation it is found that there has been no mistake made then my will and desire is that the Two hundred dollars shall be divided equally between my four brothers named in this my last will.

My will and desire is that the executor reserve his fees and costs from each of the four shares equally.

My will and desire is that the fifty five dollars remaining I reserve for incidentals and if more is needed let it be taken from each share equally. If any is left over or any comes in from other sources let the executor divide equally among the four brothers named in this my last will.

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friend J. J. Carls my Law full executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made.
