

# Will Docket To July Session 1832

Margaret Price's Will:

"In the name of God Amen."

"I Margaret Price, residing on North Honey Creek in the County of Buncombe, in the State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and memory, and calling to mind that death is certain and my continuance in this life uncertain; and thinking it necessary to make arrangements in respect to my temporal matters, and first of all I wish to call up all the power of my mind to give thanks to a merciful God for all the blessings and mercies that he hath been pleased to bless me with, therefore I do make and publish this my last Will and Testament. And such worldly substance as it hath pleased God to bless me with, I will and devise all follows: and first I desire my body to be decently buried near the residence of my sister Sarah Young, the necessary expenses of the same to be paid out of my estate by my Executor hereinafter named. I will and bequeath to my well beloved brother Alexander Price, all my lands in the County of Buncombe on the waters of North Honey Creek, and all the graine that may be growing on the same at the time of my death; also to my said Brother Alexander Price ten dollars in money, the same being money I owe him, and one note being out for the same; also ten bushels of corn out of any corn I may have on hand. At my decease or the value thereof, I will and devise to my well beloved niece Margaret Steele, my side Saddle & 1 white Counterpane, and one Corset and one cotton dress. I will and devise to Mary Williams, wife of Daniel Williams five bushels of corn, also to John Price five bushels of corn, also to Joseph Young five bushels of corn, also to Edward Williams five bushels of corn; I will and devise to my well beloved niece Margaret Young, daughter of my sister Sarah all my pot & vessels, & kitchen furniture, also my large Walnut Chest. I will & devise to Silworth son of Margaret Young, one Cow and calf, also to Margaret Young 1 Corset. I will and devise to my niece Susannah Curtis one Corset, also a small Trunk & 1 pair Cotton stockings, also one Counterpane double wove. I will and devise to Araminta Young, daughter of Joseph Young, two bed quilts also a heifer yearling. I will and devise to Martha Williams daughter of Elizabeth Williams, one bed quilt and one Counterpane. I will and devise to Martha Williams daughter of Martha Williams, one bed quilt. I will and devise to Martha Williams, one bed. I will and devise to Sarah Young, wife of Joseph Young, one bunch of spun thread. I will and devise to Ann Curtis, daughter of Benjamin Curtis Jr, one of my cotton dresses, or frock. I will and devise to Mary Williams wife of Daniel Williams one pair Cotton stockings. I will and devise to Elizabeth Price, daughter of my Brother Ambrose, one Counterpane double wove. I will and devise to Adeline Williams, daughter of E. P. Williams 1 Counterpane. I will and devise to Margaret Young, daughter of my sister Sarah, three under sheets, one Counterpane double wove and all my earthen ware. I will and devise to Margaret Price daughter of Robert Price one Counterpane. I will and devise to my well beloved sister Elizabeth Williams, two Counterpains, & my cloak. I will and devise to Mary Williams wife of Daniel Williams one cotton frock, I will and devise to Araminta Young, daughter of Jo Young two shynners.

Margaret Seice's will Contin.

"I will and devise to Catharine Seice, wife of James P. Seice, my little  
 " spinning wheel. I will and devise to Joseph Youngs wife my cotton  
 " cards and large spinning wheel. I will and devise to Helen Ann  
 " Williams daughter of Daniel Williams one cotton frock white  
 " I will and devise to Ann Curtis daughter of Benjamin Curtis one  
 " white dress. I will and devise to Savannah Williams daughter of  
 " of Daniel Williams one calico frock. I will and devise to Nancy  
 " Seice daughter of John P. Seice, one cotton dress  
 " I will and devise to Benjamin Curtis's two youngest daughters one bed  
 " quilt each. I will and devise that all my household & kitchen  
 " furniture farming tools and other property, belonging to me and  
 " herein before named, be sold at a credit of six months and the  
 " moneys arising from the same, to be divided equally amongst the  
 " children of my brother Ambrose Seice, and my sisters Sarah Young  
 " and Elizabeth Williams. I will and devise to Edward P. Williams, one note  
 " which I hold on Reuben Seaves, for twenty three Dollars, due 6<sup>th</sup> day of April 1851  
 " marked with the letter A. I will and devise that all the balance of  
 " my notes and accounts which I now have, be collected by my said Executor &  
 " the same to be distributed as follows - viz:

" To Thomas Neal \$5.00 to John Williams \$5.00 To Robert Seice \$5.00  
 " To Aldecker Williams \$5.00 To James Seice \$5.00 To Nancy Williams \$5.00  
 " To John P. Seice \$10.00 To Malvina Williams \$5.00 To Ambrose Seice \$5.00  
 " To Savannah Curtis \$5.00 To Elizabeth Williams \$10.00 To Mary Williams \$5.00  
 " To Sarah Young \$10.00 To Parthana Shock \$5.00 To Margaret Young \$5.00  
 " To Nancy Morgan \$5.00 To Silworth Young \$5.00 To Temperance H. Fox \$5.00  
 " To Joseph Young \$5.00 To Peter Seice \$5.00 To Martha Williams \$5.00  
 " To Matilda Sharp \$5.00 To Sarett Williams \$5.00

" The above named sums to be paid as above, provided by notes be sufficient  
 " if not a dividend to be declared to pay in proportion. Any money which I  
 " may have on hand at the time of my decease to be used in paying my  
 " funeral expenses &c, & the overplus if any to be divided between Ambrose  
 " Seice, Alexander Seice, Sarah Young, & Elizabeth Williams.

" I hereby constitute and appoint Solomon A. Young & Saml P. Judger  
 " my true & lawful Executors to carry out this will.

" Signed, sealed & published in presence of us this 15<sup>th</sup> day of June 1852
