Pots - one set of knives & forks - six Chairs - and how else
Item 2^d I give and devise to Edmon J. Roberson and
Mary J. Roberson infant Children of John H. Roberson
one Bed each - Item 3^d I give and bequeath to my beloved
sister Harriet M. Roberson, Wife of John H. Roberson all
Wearing apparel - one large iron large Wash Pot one
Pot Rack one Iron Rod and Swift - Item 4^d I give and
devise to my beloved nephew John H. Roberson all my
property of every description not here in before mentioned
including Dut Cubboards - an Iron Wood Mill &
to be his and at his Brevicomb Coatesville 1831 to 1868. (Continued)

And lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my worthy Friend and Neffew John H. Robeson my lawful Executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last Will and Testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and Clause thereof.

joining lands with Charles West R. P. Kelly - Tolman
Wilson & others containing two hundred and five
acres more or less - also the following stock to wit
three Mules - also the Cattle and all the Household
Machinery in my Martha with all the increase missing
therefrom also all the Corn, wheat, Bacon hogs
grazing formerly & plantations implements & lumber also
one Donkey mule that goes.

Provided that nothing herein contained shall be so construed
as to conflict with the deed record by our good
Sister Alexander the twenty sixth day of June
one thousand eight hundred and fifty six during
my life time, Martha signed and witnessed this
the twentieth day of May
