

Last Will and Testament of Mary Janet Moody,

I Mary Janet Moody wife of Charles E. Moody of the town of Wauwatosa in the County of Milwaukee and State of Wisconsin being of sound mind make and publish this as and for my last will and testament.

I direct first that my just debts and funeral expenses shall be paid.

I hereby give devise and bequeath to my husband Charles E. Moody if he shall survive me able and singular the estate which I may die possessed of or entitled to giving him full power and authority to sell or otherwise dispose of the same or any part thereof to his sole use and benefit if at any time he shall desire so to do and to enjoy the use and profits thereof.

If my said husband shall not survive me or shall die without having disposed of my said estate to his own use as herein before authorized then such estate or such portion thereof as shall remain so undispensed of shall be divided in equal portions among my own children and Emeline Eleanor Moody the daughter of said Charles E. Moody by a former marriage and their representatives such representative however taking only a representative share of the share of the child he or she shall represent and provided if the said Emeline Eleanor shall at the time of my death have received from her father by will any estate greater in value than the share in his estate which shall have been received by each of my children from him then said Emeline Eleanor shall receive from my estate only such amount as will make her share in my estate together with that so received from her father's estate equal in the aggregate to the share of each child so received from my said husband's estate and

from mine.

I hereby constitute and appoint my said husband Charles E. Moody sole executor of this will and direct and request that he shall not be required to give any security or assurance whatever for the performance of his duties as such
