Obdiah Holcombe last will and testament

In the name of God Amen I Obdiah Holcombe of the County of Buncombe
and State of Carolina being afflicted and weak in body but of perfect
Mind and Memory calling unto mind the Mortality of my body and Knowing
that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last
will and testament and as touching such worldly Estate wherewithal it has pleased
God to bless me with in this life I Give devise and dispose of in the following
manner and form

1st I give and bequeath to my beloved Sons & daughters the heirs of the body of
my first wife as follows First, Henry, Elizabeth, Alice, Peggy, Obdiah, Richard,
James, Ning, Charles, Cynthia, Elizabey and fourth Holcombe the sum of one
Dollar each with the exception of Alice and I give to him the sum of four Dollars
it being about the amount that he owes me besides what they have heretofore
Received of my Estate

2nd I give to my Grand Son Henry Holcombe the House that he has heretofore
Received and got in possession

3rd I also give and bequeath to Miller my present and only beloved wife the sum
of Ten Dollars

4th I give to my two daughters heirs of the body of my last wife above the sum of one
Dollar each all of which sum to be paid over to her out of my Estate

5th I also give and bequeath to my three Sons, James & John & Obdiah Holcombe
all of the balance of my Estate Both Real and personal Share & Share Alike

6th It is my will that my present wife Continue to live on my land after my Death
during her widowhood of the choice to do so but if she marries again not attend that
liberty

7th It is also my will that my Executor shall have the sole Control and Management
of my four Eldest Children heirs of the body of my present **Buncombe Co. NC Wills 1831 to 1868**

8th It is also My will that my Executor after my death take possession of my Estate

9th I also Constitute Make and ordain Henry H. Holcombe and John Doney the sole
Executors of this my last will and testament Ratified and confirm this and
No other to be my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and Seal this twelfth day of August in the Year of our Lord
one thousand Eight hundred & forty one Sigma Seals published pronouned
and adscribed by the same Obdiah Holcombe as his last will and testament in the
presence of us who have hereunto Subscribed our Names
