In the name of God amen, Elizabeth Ingle of Buncombe County, being of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be God. I do this thirtieth first of December in the year of 1841. I make and publish this my last will and testament in manner following, that is to say. I give and bequeath unto my beloved children, Mary Ingle to have the sheep that she now claims, one cow and calf that she now claims three head of these and one bed and furniture that she now claims, one walnut table, one chest that she now claims, one hog wheel and one cheese reel one little wheel one loom my wearing clothes and furs, and a half of new linen cloth the largest set.

John Ingle to have one black mare that he now claims and the youngest white heifer one year with lamb, one sow, one bed and stand and under tick one sheet, one blanket, one quilt and two pillows.

Alfred Henderson Ingle to have one red heifer with calf, and four sheep, one red calf and one colt one clock, half the out hogs with the exception of one to John, one bed and half the bed clothes and one bed stand.

Albert Anderson Ingle to have one brown mare one brown cow and the oldest white heifer and four sheep & half the out hogs and one bed and half the bed clothes one bed stand.

And the balance of the household furniture to Henderson and Anderson and the corn and the oats and the roughness and the fat hogs to the use of the family.

First I give and bequeath and hereby make and ordain my friend John D. Penley Executor of my last will and testament. In witness whereof I the said Elizabeth Ingle have to this my last will and testament set my hand and seal the day and year above written, signed sealed, published and delivered by the said Elizabeth Ingle the testator as her last will & testament in the presence of us who were present at the time of signing and sealing thereof.
