Rosannah Young's Will.

I, Rosannah Young, widow and relict of John Young, do hereby make
 ordain and establish this my last Will & Testament in manner and
 form following-to-wit: First, I will and bequeath to my daughter
 Mary Edmondson, her heirs and assigns forever, the money placed by me in
 the hands of David Gannon together with the interest ^{what} ~~that~~ may have
 accrued thereon, the principal sum is Two Hundred & Ninety five
 Dollars & Ten Cents or thereabouts, and also One Hundred Dollars
 of the amount, coming to me from the proceeds, of the sale of the real
 Estate of my dear Sister Mary Hemphill. Secondly I will and
 bequeath to my son Thos. J. Young his heirs and assigns the One Hundred
 Dollars of the sum due me out of the proceeds, of the sale of the real
 Estate of my dear Sister Mary Hemphill. Third, I will and bequeath
 to my Grand daughter Martha Ann Edmondson, all the balance of
 the sum ~~due~~ coming to me out of the proceeds, of the sale of the real
 Estate of my dear Sister Mary Hemphill.

I hereby appoint Joshua Roberts sole Executor of this my last Will &
