the expense of which to be paid out of my Estate by my Executor herein after
named

I will and desire that my said lands be equally divided
between my wife Mary Caroline Reece and my two children Laura Josephine
and Eliza Ann in such manner as to allow my wife to have the house in
which I now live I will and desire that all my moveable property both
in the house as well as that out of doors, except my smith tools & carpenters tools
be equally divided between my said wife Mary Caroline and my two children
Laura Josephine and Eliza Ann And that none of the above named personal property
except such as shall be herein after provided be sold, I will and desire that my
said Executor herein after named shall sell my said Smith and Carpenter tools
as the law directs to pay my debts, I may owe or other necessary expenses, and any
monies in the sale of the last named should be left, the same to be used by my
wife in purchasing such necessaries as she may think proper

I request that my wife become guardian for my two children above named
I hereby constitute my said wife Mary Caroline Reece My Executor to carry this
will into effect In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
affixed my seal in the presence of the witnesses who signed the same in
the presence of each other The words to be sealed and wife intimated before signed

of sound mind and memory But considering the uncertainty of my earthly
existence do make and declare this my last will and testament in manner
and form as follows That is to say First that my Executor herein after named shall provide for my body a
decent burial suited to the wishes of my relatives & friends and
pay all funeral expenses together with my just debts hereover and
to whomsoever owing best of the money that shall first come into
his hands as a part and parcel of my estate Then 1st I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Eliza Stapp all
my property consisting of Lands houses-mules, cattle, sheep, hogs
house hold and kitchen furniture together with every other species
of property of whatever kind and all money, stocks and other kinds
of debt that may be due me at my death And further in case
of my death it is my wish and desire that my said wife in
raising our family sell or dispose of any species of property she
may desire of whatever kind she thinks best And further it is
my wish and desire that in case my beloved wife should survive
me that she give off to our children as they come of age or as
she desire with our said children as she may think proper
And further it is my wish and desire that in case of my beloved wife's
death that my beloved children to stay and remain together
and when they all arrive to be of age then for them to divide
my said property among themselves to share & share alike and
in case they can't agree in the division of said property then
to have it done by disinterested persons so as to share alike
as near as possible And further I do constitute and appoint
 Fletcher Hartung Executor of this my last will and testament
according to the true intent and meaning of the same
