I do will and bequeath all my personal and real estate to my beloved wife Eleanor Ashley during her natural life and at the expiration of her life I further will that all the personal and real estate shall be equally divided in equal parts between my daughter Harriet Poppley my daughter Sarah Castleton my daughter Susanna Jordan my daughter Eleanor Garland my daughter Helida Hefen and Patience Brady and Elizabeth Jordan my grand daughter to have an equal part to be divided in a manner determining with themselves by sale or otherwise in testimony I have hereunto set my hand this day and date above mentioned

Middleton five Dollars the balance of my afffectio bonds and and personal to my wife Nancy to have and to hold unto her own proper use and benefit during her natural life to be disposed of by her as she may think proper by will or otherwise in writing thereof I have this 14th day of May in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty four set my hand and seal
