my life insurance policies as follows: one policy for
the sum of Two Thousand Dollars in the Equitable
Life Assurance Society of the United States, number
and one policy for the sum of Three Thousand
Dollars in the Royal Arcanum, to my Mother,
Louisa H. Branch.

Sixth:

I appoint my Mother, Louisa H. Branch,
executrix of this my will
in witness whereof I Christian Jordan Branch,
have to this my last will & testament subscribed
my name & affixed my seal this the 29 day of

October, 1871
