In the name of God, Amen, I William McBrayer of the County of Buncombe County and State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and memory but much in bodily strength, am calling to mind the uncertainty of my natural life, do make, publish and declare this cause no other to be my last will and testament:

First. - I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth one bay horse, and all my cattle, hogs and sheep, household and kitchen furniture and dwelling house and lots, for her own use during the life of her family that remains with her, and to dispose of the same as she thinks best.

Second. - I will and bequeath to my said wife Elizabeth all my real estate lying and being in the said County of Buncombe and in the same town where I now live, adjoining lands of George Wright, L. C. Blagdon, son<sup>a</sup> and James McBrayer, next older, when I shall die, for hundred and twelve acres more or less, to have and to hold for and during the term of her natural life, and then to go to my four daughters to wit: Mary Elizabeth, Lucy Anne, Millie Matilda, Levinia Adelia, equal as tenants in common, and to be divided as they may think proper: but it case that it should be necessary to sell any portion of said real estate for the payment of any debts or expenses made during my lifetime or for my funeral expenses, I hereby authorize my said wife to sell and convey the same in fee simple, but only so much thereof as may be necessary for the payment of said debts and expenses and no more,

Third. - I will and bequeath to my four daughters, my dear gray mare, big gray mare, and her increase, and her foal, to have and to hold in tenancy in common. In witness whereof I have set my hand and seal the 26<sup>th</sup> day of August ad 1887.

J Silas James, of the County and State  
aforesaid, being over in my fifty seventh year,  
and knowing in the course of nature must soon  
leave the walls of men, I therefore make and ordain  
this to be my last will and testament, viz:

I will and desire that after my death my  
body be decently buried in the Turkey Creek  
Grave Yard near the place where my wife is  
buried, that is if I die in this part of the Country.  
I also will and desire that all my just debts be  
paid, and I desire that my effects or my  
property and estate be divided as follows: 1<sup>st</sup>  
The lands which I have bequeathed to my son John  
who is the son of my last wife, I desire that title  
shall stand. The lands which I have bequeathed to my  
daughter Alice, which is the daughter of my late  
wife, I desire that title shall stand. The lands  
which I have bequeathed to my son Thomas, who is the  
youngest son of my last wife, I desire that that  
title shall stand. I desire that my property  
and effects be disposed of as follows: I desire further  
that my wife, if she lives longer than I do, to  
have all my property, moves and effects with  
which to raise the children, to her heirs as long as she  
lives to make her comfortable. At her death, it is  
my will that whatever is left of my said estate  
is to be divided equally among my last wife's  
other children, which are minors, and to carry on  
this will I desire that Adolphus Hardin be my  
Executor of this my last will and testament, and  
this I desire because I fear that I have a feeble  
mind and after mature deliberation, ame hope that  
all my children will be satisfied.
