

The Last Will and Testament of hon. McDonnell

J. William McCollum, of the county of Buncombe, and State of North Carolina, being of sound and perfect mind and memory, blessed be God, to this, twenty second day of January, in the year of our Lord, eighteen hundred and thirty eight, make this, my last will and testament, in manner following, that is to say:

Ist I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife, Rhoda McCollum, the plantation on which I now live, with all its appertinences, during her natural life or widowhood; also, I bequeath unto my aforesaid beloved wife, four negroes, to wit: Levi, Harry, Caroline, and Peggy, during natural her life and widowhood, to be kept and remain on the aforesaid plantation, to cultivate the same, for the comfortable support of my aforesaid wife; also, I give and bequeath unto my nephew William Hemphill, after the death ^{or marriage} of my beloved wife, aforesaid, Plantation, with all its appertinences, on his paying three hundred dollars to Charged Grimes, the relick of James Grimes, deceased, or to my nephew, Charles Grimes or my niece Lucy Morris, the wife of William Morris, to be equally divided the aforesaid Charles and Lucy, so that they share and share alike, after the death or marriage of my beloved wife aforesaid; I give and bequeath unto my nephews, Andrew McCollum and Thomas McCollum, the four aforesaid negroes, that is to say, Levi, Harry, Caroline, and Peggy, and their increase, to be equally divided between the aforesaid nephews, Andrew and Thomas McCollum, so that they share and share alike, on their paying one hundred and fifty dollars each to my brother-in-law George Patton; also, I give and bequeath unto my nephew, James Morris, four negroes, to wit: Sue, Jessie, Anna and James; Michael, on his paying three hundred dollars to James Dunnmore, my brother-in-law; also, I give and bequeath unto my brother-in-law, Andrew Hemphill, four negroes, Lucy, Mary, Andrew and Charles, and their increase, on his paying to my sister Sarah Grimes three hundred dollars; also, I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife, Rhoda McCollum, one wagon and two horses and live years, all to be of her own choice; also, ten head of cattle of her own choice; also, all the household and kitchen furniture of every kind; also my Smith's tools, together with all my farming tools, ploughs and gears; also, fifteen head of sheep of her own choice, also, twenty head of hogs, all of her own choice, also, a rifle gun of her own choice, during her natural life-time and widowhood. It is also my will and desire after her natural death or widowhood, to leave all the aforesaid property and stock, to wit: The aforesaid wagon horses etc., to the heirs of my son, John McCollum.

years, all the aforesaid sheep, hogs and gun, to be sold at twelve months credit, and the monies arising therefrom to be equally divided between my brother-in-law James Densmore, my Sister, Sarry Grimes, my Sister, Margaret Grimes, Mary Cle-Donnell, Elizabeth Cle-Donnell, daughters of my brother James Cle-Donnell; also, Margaret and Elizabeth, daughters of my brother Archable, Cle-Donnell, so that they share and share alike. My will and desire is, that all my horses, Little Sheep and hogs, wagons and guns not left to my wife, be sold at twelve months credit; out of the monies arising therefrom, I direct my Executor to pay unto my brother-in-law George Eaton, fifty dollars; I also direct my Executor to pay unto my Nephew, Col. Thomas Clowes, one hundred dollars; also to pay unto Andrew Densmore one hundred dollars, and the balance of the aforesaid monies to be equally divided between Thomas, Andrew, James, Samuel, Archable, John, and Benjamin Dempsey, also, James Clowes, so that they share and share alike; and I hereby make and ordain worthy friends, Andrew Dempsey, Executor of this my last will and testament in witness whereof, I, the said William Cle-Donnell, have to this, my last will and testament, set my hand and seal the day and year above written.

The last Will and testament of William Cockran.

I, William Cockran, of the County, and State above
named, being very weak in body, but of perfect mind and
memory, do make and publish this my last will and testament, hereby
Renking all former wills by me at any time made, and first, I give
my soul to God, from whom I received it, and my body to the earth, to
be buried in a neat and decent burial, and as to such worldly estate
as it has been pleased God to bless me with, I dispose of it as follows:
Item I give to my two youngest Sons, Closes and Nathaniel, two hundred
acres of land, whereon we now live is one hundred, and the other hundred
lying adjoining Swau Cockran Item I give to my two daughters,
Sister and Henrietta one hundred acres of land, where a watershed
Cleaching now stands, called the Bancer tract, to be equally between
them two. Item I give my daughter Clara Rodgers, one Cow and
Calf. Item I give to my two little Grand Children, children of
E. B. Praytor, a two year old cow brute, apiece Item I give my son
Swau, five Dollars, and the balance of my property, to this:
all the balance of my stock of all kinds, together with my
household and Kitchen furniture, I give to Closes, Nathaniel, Clara
and Henrietta, and they are to take care of their mother, and
support her decently out of the same; and I do hereby make and
ordain Closes and Nathaniel Cockran Executors of this my last will
and testament so witness whereof, I, William Cockran, the testator,
have to this my will and testament set my hand and seal, this the
Tenth day of October, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight
hundred and forty-one.
