

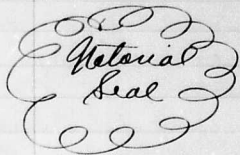

I, Minnie Slagle being of sound mind and memory do give devise and bequest to my daughter Maggie Halyburton, her heirs and assigns forever my lot in the City of Asheville County of Buncombe, State of North Carolina all my lot known as the Slagle Hotel lot and appurtenances thereto belonging including the ground floor under the store room and the bedrooms above the store room on the said lot also all the furniture in and connected with said hotel consisting of one piano and all the furniture in the parlor all the bureaus, bedsteads, beds, tables, chairs, table furnishings, stools, and looking utensils and all the appointments appurtenances that are used about the lot and hotel.

Also I devise and bequest to my said daughter Maggie Halyburton a lot of land of between nine and ten acres in Chatham County and State above written purchase of A. P.
