In the name of God amen I Daniel England of the County of
Berk in the State of North Carolina being sick and in a weak but
sound in mind and memory and desiring to make an account of
life and mortality of man and the certainty of death and being
ready to settle my worldly affairs on this the ninth day of
September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
eighteen make and publish this my last will and testament
in manner and form as follows to wit

First I do will and bequeath unto my well Beloved wife Margaret
England all that part of the tract of land in which I now live
lying on the west side of Hunting Creek adjoining the
old dwelling house with its appurtenances to her and her
heirs forever during her widowhood and no longer. I do will
and bequeath equally among all my children I do will
and bequeath unto my said well Beloved wife Margaret
my negro girl called Hester during her widowhood and
no longer then my will is that of the said negro girl Hester
and her increase to be sold and divided among all my children
equally share and share alike if so further give and bequeath

I do will and bequeath unto my well Beloved wife Margaret
two hundred dollars I do will give and bequeath unto my well Beloved wife Margaret
my horse called Polly during her widowhood and no longer

I do further will to my wife Margaret one cow and calf and
all the furniture with its furniture during her widow-
hood and no longer I do will give and bequeath unto my
wife Margaret my cash on hand her widowhood and no longer
I do will give and bequeath to my son Elisha all the land that
I hold on the east side of Hunting Creek to him and his

heirs forever I do will give and bequeath to my son Elisha my still and still
and all the furniture with its furniture forever

I do will give and bequeath to my son Elisha my negro
girl called Hester forever on condition that the

boy Nathan to him and his heirs forever on condition that the

said Nathan shall pay or cause to be paid to the executor of
my estate for the benefit of said estate three hundred dollars

otherwise the boy Nathan to be sold and the sum obtained over
five hundred dollars to belong to my son Elisha only

I do will give and bequeath to my son Richard my negro
man Frank to him and his heirs forever on condition that

the said Richard shall pay or cause to be paid to the executor
of my estate for the benefit of said estate two hundred dollars

otherwise the negro man Frank to be sold and the sum obtained
two hundred dollars to belong to my son Elisha only

I do will give and bequeath to my daughter Maria five hundred
dollars and one feather bed with its furniture such as is now in
my house

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I do hereby give and Bequeth unto my daughter Jane two hundred
dollars and Bequeth to her heirs forever I do also will to my daughter
Jane one cow and one feather Bed with its furniture to her
and her heirs forever

I do will give and Bequeth to my daughter Nancy two hundred
dollars and fifty dollars to her and her heirs forever

I do will give and Bequeth to my daughter Deborah
one hundred and fifty dollars to her and her heirs forever

I do will give and Bequeth unto my son Joseph one hundred
and fifty dollars to him and his heirs forever

my will is and I do Bequeth unto the children of my deceased
son John England one hundred and fifty dollars to be
divided among them equally share and share alike

I do will give and Bequeth to my daughter Mary five hundred
and sixty dollars to her and her heirs forever

I do will give and Bequeth to my daughter Susanna two
hundred dollars and also to her one cow and one feather
Bed with its furniture to her and her heirs forever

I do will give and Bequeth to my granddaughter Margaret
five hundred dollars to her and her heirs forever

my will is and it is direct that my executors hereafter
to be named shall sell and dispose of all the Residue of my
estate movable both Real and Personal for the Benefit of my
legitimate and it is my will that after the payment of the
debts due by me herein in this will and the expense attending
the administration of the said estate that the balance if any shall
be there divided equally share and share alike among all my
children and their heirs make or appoint my son
John Williams executor of this my last
will and testament whereof I have here to set my hand
and affixed myself to this my last will and testament the day
and year above written
