mind and memory and calling to mind the
Mortality of my body and knowing that it is
appointed for all men once to die do make
and ordain this my Last will and Testament
That is to say principally and first of all I
Recommend my Soul to allmighty god that gave it
and my body to the Earth to be Buried in a decent
Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors
Nothing doubting at the general Resurrection I
shall receive the same by the mighty power of
god; and as touching such worldly Estate as
it hath pleased god to bless me with I give
and bequeath in the following manner and
form Viz

Item 1st I give and bequeath to daughter Sally
Foxe a brown bow with a white face which she is
in possession of at this time with her increase

Item 2nd I give and bequeath to my Son William Foxe
one red bow with a broken horn; and my large
powder horn

Item 3rd I give and bequeath to my Son in Law
Alexander Thompson twenty Shillings in money

Item 4th I give and bequeath to my two Grand
daughters Rachel and Polly Foxe three Hundred
acres of Land Lying on big rock to be divided
equally between them

The ballance of my property that I may be
in possession of at my decease to be sold by
my Executors and after paying my just debts
to be Equally divided among my living children

and I hereby make and ordain my worthy friend
Philip Austin and Alfred Hartley Executors of this my
Last will and Testament, Revoking all others on
witness whereof I the said Hugh Fox have to this
my Last will & Testament ~~set~~ my hand and
Seal the day and year above written
