I will to my sister Eve Troutman that was one silver dollar and to her children I also will one dollar each, named Michael, Mary Melker, Peter, George Andrew Eve Katy to each of them one dollar one year after my decease. and all the remainder after these legacies paid them, she, my beloved wife Elizabeth Hartman to have and to hold forever and to will at her decease as she may think proper.

I likewise constitute, make and ordain the said Elizabeth my beloved wife to be the executors of this my last will and Testament and I do hereby utterly disallow and revoke all former Testaments, wills Legacies and executors ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament In witness whereof I have thereunto set my hand and seal this twenty-fourth of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eleven.
