Item. I leave the use of my part of the building to my Brother & Sister as they may choose to remain in the plantation.

Item. I give & bequeath negro Cynthia to Elsha Sanyer daughter of William Sanyer to him & his heirs forever. and I hereby make and appoint my friend Sourdaw Jarry executor to this my last will & Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the date above written.

I Ambrose Burfoot of the County of Camden State of Maryland being weak of body but of perfect sound mind and memory thanks be given unto God, and calling unto mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die. I do make and ordain this to be my last will & Testament, disavowing all other wills heretofore by me made - which I give and dispose in manner and form as follows.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my dear beloved daughter Polly Sanyer that tract of Land that I bought of Joseph Medham, containing about thirty seven acres to her & her heirs lawfully begotten of her body forever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my dear beloved daughter Lucia Williams that tract of Land that I bought of John Wright containing about forty acres to her & her heirs lawfully begotten of her body forever.

Item. I leave the use of the Land and plantation (where I now live) also a small tract of Land that I bought of Prudence Oyster unto my dear beloved wife Mary Burfoot - also two comfortable bedrooms one made by the name of Ben, two feather beds & furniture her choice, two linen chests, one beautiful & creckery in it, one chest, and all the kitchen furniture until death or marriage, and at death or marriage as hereafter named - it further my will that my wife Mary Burfoot should have one cow & pigs, six Hares, chickens, also four head of sheep & calves.

Item. I give & bequeath unto my dear beloved son Robert Burfoot, the small tract of Land containing about fifty acres, one saddle, & sixty dollars in good money for the purpose of purchasing a horse to him & his heirs lawfully begotten of his body forever.

Item. I give & bequeath unto my dear beloved son Sater Burfoot all the Land that I now hold in the Great Island to him & his heirs lawfully begotten of his body forever.

Item. I give & bequeath unto my dear beloved son John Burfoot, that tract of Land in Sandy Hook containing sixty acres to him & his heirs lawfully begotten of his body forever.

Item. It further my will that my dear beloved son Willis Burfoot & William Burfoot at my wife's death or marriage should have the plantation I now live in also a small tract I bought of Prudence Oyster.

I further my will that the house and lot down the river should sold in a tract of twelve months also my negro *Supra* & negro *Robert* should be sold in the above named tract, and the residue of my estate consisting of stock and household furniture &c. &c. should be sold in a tract of six months

I further my will that after paying all my just debts and lawful expenses that the residue of my estate should be equally divided between my son, Robert Burfoot, Sally Burfoot, John Burfoot, Willis Burfoot, William Burfoot, to them & their heirs lawfully begotten of their body forever

Last of all I appoint & nominate my faithful and trusty friend *John* as a Robert Burfoot to be my whole sole executor - this 31 day of December 1823
