The Balance of my estate after paying my just debts in manner above mentioned to equally divided between my children namely Hephie Polly, Joseph Peter and Asa Tuttle to them & their heirs forever I also nominate and appoint my friend J. P. Bell executor to this my last Will & Testament.
