

Will Dorothy Jones.

In the name of God Amen I Dorothy Jones of the County of Camden State of North Carolina being sick but of perfect sound mind and memory thanks be given unto God for the same calling to mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make & ordain this my last will and testament in manner following -

Item First I give & bequeath unto my well beloved daughter Nancy Parnham one feather bed & furniture and all my wearing apparel but three frocks which shall be hereafter mentioned to her & her heirs forever.

Item Second I give & bequeath unto my well beloved son Ira Jones one feather bed and furniture one hand mill one Rattle one pot trammel one fat pig one small fat cat one tin gallon Jug, three sitting chairs to him and his heirs forever.

Item Third I give & bequeath unto my well beloved son Benjamin Jones one feather bed & furniture one chest one table one loom & harness one linnen wheel two iron pots one tea table one spindle one fat tub, one soap tub one pump fire Iron one pot trammel one pew-bell Susan one washing tub one waterpail one half bushel seven sitting chairs one safe one quart Jug three Reels of Yarn & all my gear & fowls one span steady and all my cooking ware to him and his heirs forever.

Item Fourth I give & bequeath unto my grand daughter Emmeas one frock to her & her heirs forever.

Item Fifth I give & bequeath unto my grand daughter Sarah Francis Jones one frock to her & her heirs forever.

Item Sixth I give & bequeath unto my grand son Isaac Jones one frock to him & his heirs forever.

I also constitute, make and ordain my beloved son Ira Jones my whole & sole Executor to this my last will & testament to do according to the legacies bequeathed in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the 12 January in the year of our Lord 1830.

Signed sealed published & pronounced by the said Dorothy Jones as her last will & testament in presence of us who in her presence & in the presence of each other have hereunto set our names as witnesses.

Will Peter Dozier.

In the name of God Amen I Peter Dozier of the State of North Carolina and County of Camden being sound mind & memory blind be God do this the twentieth day January one thousand eight hundred & twenty eight make this my last will & testament in manner following to wit -

Item - I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Patsy Dozier all the negroes I have in my possession at my death that came by her - also the third part of all my land during her natural life.

Item I give & bequeath unto my nephew Edmund Sawyer all of my land after the death of my wife the third of the same to be taken in possession immediately after my death to him and his heirs forever also one shot gun.

Item - I give & bequeath unto my nephew Isaac Fresh one negro man by the name of Sam to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my brother Enck Nash one negro woman by the name of Lydia to him & his heirs forever also one shot gun.

Item I give & bequeath unto my sister Amelia Dozier one negro man by the name of Sam to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my friend W. B. Webster one negro woman by the name of Phoebe to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give unto my brother Enck Nash all of my wearing apparel to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my sister Betsey Nash one black horse to her and her heirs forever. It is my desire that all the residue of my property to be sold & after the payment of my just debts and the residue if any I give unto my beloved wife - Should there not be a sufficiency sold at my vendue to pay my just debts it is my desire that my Executor should sell enough of my wife's negroes to discharge the same.

Lastly I nominate and appoint my loving brother Enck Nash my Executor to this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this day & date above written.

This Last will & Testament of Peter Dozier deceased was exhibited & proved in open Court by oath of Isaac M. Dozier and one of the subscribing witnesses thereto. And at the same time Enck Nash the Executor therein named appeared & qualified thereto according to Law. Ordered that detours Testamentary issued & the will be Recorded - & at the same time Patsy Dozier widow of Peter Dozier appeared in open Court & disclaimed from said will.
