Item I Give and bequeath unto my daughter Sanna Taylor one Feather Bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Eliza Taylor one Feather Bed & furniture to her & her heirs forever. all the Balance of my Estate not Given away I want Sold for the purpos of paying my Lawful debts.

I hereby nominate and appoint Nelson Cartwright Executor To this my last will and Testament hereby Revoking all Wills or bequeaths here before made in Testimony whereof I have here before set my hand and seal this 23rd Jan'y 1832.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my dearly beloved son Frederick Forbes one half of my Land Running a line from East to West the south side to him and his heirs Lawfully Begotten of his Body forever.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my dearly beloved son Stephen Forbes the other half of my Land the north side to him and his heirs Lawfully Begotten of his body forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my Eldest daughter Annis Standly five Shillings to her and her heirs lawfully begotten of her Body forever

Item I Give and bequeath unto my youngest daughter Ann Williams five Shillings to her and her heirs lawfully Begotten of her

This last will & Testament of Elizabeth Forbes was proved in open court by the oath of Silas Forbes a subscribing witness thereto and Frederick Forbes one of the Executors therein named appeared and qualified as Executor thereto ordered that letters Testamentary issue &c.

Will Laban Gray In the name of God. Amen I Laban Gray of the county of Calmer in the state of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory but feeling to mind the mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed unto man once to die have and ordained this my last will & Testament denying all others by me made acknowledging the only in manner as follows.

Firstly I Give and bequeath unto my dear beloved wife Margaret Gray one certain piece of Land for and enduring the time she lives my widow as for her natural life if she do not marry beginning at a widow Eastward of the house thence westerwardly to the bars as the fence runs thence Southwardly as the fence runs to the creek thence binding the creek to the first Station together with the privilege of fire wood and Cail Timber off any part of my Land for the support of the above named Land the same length of time I also lend her the following articles for the term of her widow hood or natural life as above one desk one feather Bed & furniture first choice one chest her choice beautiful or safe and furniture ~~first~~ ^{her} choice one Table two Sining wheels first choice one Churn one wote basket and cards five dogs long & shord Spining stuff spun & unspun one pair flat iron and all the side board furniture all the knives & forks you shall

Laban Grays will contd first choice six chairs first choice all the Kitchen furniture two cows and one heifer yearling first choice one year provisions one Gilt and sufficient number of dry hogs for an other years pork six dry Bll first choice soap & barrel all my Tools and case my own cutting axe and light wood axe and my wearing close for her to divide as she pleases also my mare and cart one plow and harness first choice one hoe 1st choice the dunghill poultry all the wooden ware a two Gallon and a one Gallon Jugg all the Lunk & Ditties one case and bottles one Looking one pr. Stulys one candle stick one pr. of mashing bars to her while she lives my widow or for her natural life if she do not marry and no longer

Secondly I Give and bequeath to my beloved Grandson Saban J. Williams a certain piece of Land lying in the County of sd for and enduring his natural life and no longer beginning at a white oak at the head of Johnathan Creek thence to a white Gum corner thence Northwardly to a white oak thence down the Swamp - Eastwardly to the creek thence binding the creek to the first Station provided never the less that the above named Saban J. Williams should have an heir lawfully begotten of his Body this my will that the above named Land should be there and to there heirs forever but if he die without heir it is my will that at his death my Grandson John Williams should have the use of it enduring his natural life then to his heirs lawfully begotten of his Body if any if none at his death to my son Joshua Gray and to his heirs forever one feather Bed and furniture one Traupah at the death or marriage of my wife also one desk and case and bottles one small gun to him and his heirs forever also one

Thirdly I Give and bequeath to my Grandson John Williams one feather Bed and Armoire and fine bedstead one ax to him and his heirs forever.

Fourthly I Give and bequeath to my son Joshua Gray all my Land that I have not Given away also all Rest of my property together with one half of the property that I lent my wife for paying all my last debts and paying Peter P. Baum for his wright in the Land that I gave Saban J. Williams and the other half of the property I lent to my wife not given away to be Equally divided between my two Grand sons Saban & John Williams. also I make and ordain dear beloved wife and my friend Saban V Gray Executors to this my last will and Testament and I do hereby utterly deny all other wills by me made confirming and no other
