Also - Make & appoint my son Demsey Lurry and Eian Lurry Senr & Eian Lurry Junr Executors & Executors to this my last will & Testament -

4th Should the promissory notes and Cash remaining after my decease be found insufficient to fulfill these bequests it is my will that the deficiency be made up out of the remaining part of either my personal or real property, as my Executors may consider most beneficial to the concerned -

5th To my dearly beloved wife Fanny Gordon and those children I have
