Item I give the bequeath unto my dearly beloved daughter son Emanuel Brown five Shillings currency of this State when this dies forever - when after reserving enough to pay all my just debts & lawful expenses its then further my will that Susannah Forbes should have all the residue of my estate within & without doors also all my wearing apparel all the money notes & debts that on hand at my death when she dies forever. Its further my will if the said Susannah Forbes should die before she has an heir lawfully begotten of her body that the whole of my estate as before mentioned go to & belong to my daughter Sarah Griffin then her heirs forever. Last of all I appoint & nominate my faithful and truly friend John H. Wright and Elias Forbes to be my whole & sole Executors this 28. day of August in the year of our Lord 1827.
