This was exhibited in open court and proved as the last will & testament of Isaac Sandloth dec'd by the oaths of Lemmy P. Mornette & Martin Galliot subscribing witnesses therto - And at same time Elias Forbes the Executor therein named appeared & qualified as such in due form of law. Ordered that letters testamentary issue do be -

Will Isaac G. Gregory

In the name of God amen I make this my last will as follows that to wist that I commend myself to God and my worldly affairs in manner and form as follows. September 22 day 1828.

First I give and bequeath unto two Brothers Dorris & Casan Gregory all my share of the land in Sandy hook also my share of the land called beach ridge known by the name of Freshwaters place & also my beach ridge land formerly belonging to James Paultite to be equally divided between them share & share. I leave with my brother Dorris Gregory to be for my sister Polly Gilbert one acres of land which is mentioned in my mothers will when her she think proper - I also leave with my brother Dorris Gregory fifty dollars to the use of my sister Polly Gilbert to be paid out as he may think proper - I also give my red & white pided knife by name of Diana keeper to my friend John Gregory - I give my horn to my brother Dorris Gregory - I give to Dorris Gregory one red keeper - I also leave and appoint my friend John Gregory my sole Executor to this my last will and testament the day above written. Signed & sealed in presence of.

Will Sarah Brown

In the name of God amen! Sarah Brown of the County of Camden & State of north Carolina being weak in body but of perfect sound mind and memory thanks be given unto God calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men & women once to die I do make & ordain this to be my last will and testament disavowing and revoking all other wills and gifts heretofore by me made - I Give and dispose in manner and form as follows.

Item I give bequeath unto my dear, beloved daughter Rebecca Osborne five shillings currency of this state when she heirs forever.

Item I give bequeath unto my dear, beloved daughter Margaret Mercer five shillings currency of this state when she heirs forever.

Item I give bequeath unto my dear, beloved daughter Sarah Griffin five shillings currency of this state when she heirs forever.

Item I give bequeath unto my dear, beloved daughter son Emanuel Brown five shillings currency of this state when this heirs forever.

When after reserving enough to pay all my just debts & lawful expenses it shall further my will that Susannah Forbes should have all the residue of my estate within & without doors also all my wearing apparel all the money notes & debts that are due at my death whether heirs or not. As further my will if the said Susannah Forbes should die before she had an heir lawfully begotten of her body that the whole of my estate as before mentioned go to & belong to my daughter Sarah Griffin then heirs forever. Last of all I appoint & nominate my faithful and true friend John B. Wright and Elias Forbes to be my whole & sole Executors this 28. day of August in the year of our Lord 1827.
