Also I bequeath unto my two daughters Polly & Sean Gray after the death
or marriage of my wife all the personal part of my estate which my
wife held at that time - Also I give to my two daughters Polly & Sean
Gray all the personal part of my estate which my wife Melba did not
hold at that time to them & their heirs forever -
Also I give all my crop to Polly & Sean Gray after taking out my wife's
& family's one year provisions - also my debts & other due by notes & contracts
to them & their heirs forever - The above property to be sold in a tract of
six months - If Polly or Sean should die under twenty one the survivor
shall their legacies -

Also I give & bequeath unto my daughter Sally Gray one tract of land
which I now live on that I bought of Malachi W. Bushnell, binding
Lemmy Gregory, Peter Forbes, heirs & deep branch, containing forty
three acres the same more or less to her & her heirs forever -
And I hereby make & ordain my worthy friend Bailey Barco
Executor of this my last will & Testament in witness whereof I
the said Calit Gray to this my last will & Testament set my
hand & seal the day & year above written -

In the name of God, amen! I Isaac Harington being of sound
mind but very low in bodily health & knowing that God has appointed
all men to die blessed be his name for the same I have thought proper
to leave my worldly goods Real & Personal, that the Lord has been pleased
to bless me with in the following manner -

- 1st I commit my Body to the Earth from whence it came -
- 2^d I leave my Executors hereafter named full power as can be vested in an executor
to sell as best they may six or twelve months my Plantation I now live on
also my house & lot in Elizabeth City on the same terms - also my chattels
property to be sold on a credit of six months - And then for my Executors to
pay all my just debts & Burial expences -
- 3^d I give out of the Residue that may be left after paying all Just debts
to my five children here mentioned viz. Miles Harington, Millet Harington
son, Polly Harington, Chloe Harington, & Emory Harington one hun
dred & five dollars each to be paid by my executor as he may think they
need -

- 4th I give the Balance that may be left after paying the above Legacies or
my executor retaining the above sum in his hands & paying my debts to
Lucy Butchard wife of Olisha Butchard, Sally Clarke wife of Harvey
Clarke, Elias Harington & Isaac Harington to be equally divided
between them four as named -

- 5th I appoint & desire Abner Williams tract as my executor to this my last
will & Testament as witness I then unto set my hand & seal this the
20th of October 1823.
