otherwise as hereafter named, do make & publish this Codicil as part
of my last will & Testament.

First.

I give my cash notes & other small property, not given away in the body of
my will, but given to my said sons Isaac Lamb, John Lamb and
daughter Polly Merrill share & share alike & my will is that the Boy
George given to my said daughter Polly Merrill in the body of my will be
valued at four hundred dollars & come into this division & be a part
of her share & to make her share together with said valuation equal
to the share of my son Isaac Lamb, or the share of my son John Lamb
and it is also my will that Boy Sandy for which my son Isaac Lamb
has a bill of sale be valued at three hundred dollars & be a part of
his share in said division.

Item.

The money I sold the two negroes for say the negroes I gave in the body
of my will to Grand daughter Mary Sugor, now Palmer I give to
my executors power in trust to be laid out in the purchase of real
estate at their discretion to be conveyed the said Mary
Palmer during her natural life & no longer & then to the heirs lawfully
begotten on her body forever - the sum is five hundred & fifty dollars
out of which my said executors to retain for their trouble in buying
said land & making said conveyances - Signed, sealed & acknowledged
by me as a part of my last will and Testament the 28th day of March
1822.

In the name of God Amen I James Godfrey of Camden County &
State of N. Carolina, being of sound & perfect mind & memory calling to mind
the certainty of death & the uncertainty of the time thereof do make, publish
& Ordain this my last Will & Testament in manner & form following
that is to say

I give & bequeath to my Brother Samuel Godfrey, five shillings, to be paid
him out of my estate -

I give to my Brother William Godfrey five shillings to be paid him out of
my estate -

I give & bequeath to my Brother James Godfrey one note of hand signed
by him payable to me for fifty nine dollars & twenty cents, dated the 6th of
February 1821. also one bed & furniture - also one Red Pen to him & his heirs
forever -

I give & bequeath unto my Brother Malachi Godfrey forty five dollars, which
he now owes me.

I give & bequeath unto Polly Smother, one small horse, one Mahogany table
1/2 dozen Tea Spoons, one chest of Bed Curtains, also one negro Girl by the
name of Molly, & all my wearing apparel to her & her heirs forever -

I lend to Betsy Godfrey daughter of William Godfrey one bed & furniture
one cow & calf & one Linen wheel, her chime, & in case she has a lawful
heir or heirs, then I give her the aforesaid articles to her & her heirs forever &
in case she should die without a lawful heir, then in that case I
give the said property which I have lent her to my Brother James
& Malachi Godfrey share & share alike -

I give negro man Charles to my neighbour Willis Wilson that is
to say to be under his care & direction - To be hired out, & the one
half of the net proceeds of his hire to be paid over to my Brother Malachi

Godfrey, annually for during the term of his natural life. And at the death of my Brother Malachi I give the mortgage of the net proceeds of the hire of negro man Charles to Mitthy Godfrey daughter of Malachi Godfrey & the other fourth of his hire I wish my friend Willis Wilson to retain for his trouble.

Item.

It is my Will that my Executors hereafter named pay to my negro man Charles, five Bunches of Indian Corn, and one Bar & shote, which I owe him, to be delivered to my friend Willis Wilson for him.

Item.

All the remainder of my estate which I have not already given away I leave to be sold by my Executors, and after paying all my just debts I give the net proceeds, if any, to my Brother James & Malachi Godfrey to them & their heirs share & share alike.

Lastly.

I nominate & appoint my Brothers James Godfrey, & my friend Willis Wilson Executors to this my last Will & Testament, revoking & annulling all wills heretofore by me made ratifying this & this only to be my last Will & Testament.

In the Name of God. Amen! I Sally Hathaway of the County of Camden and State of North Carolina being weak in Body but sound in Mind & Memory blessed be almighty God for the same do make & publish this my last Will and Testament in manner & form following - viz

First.

I give & bequeath unto my Nephew James Hathaway son of Caleb & Angelica Hathaway my Bureau to him his heirs & assigns forever.

I also give & bequeath to my sister Angelica Hathaway all my Crochery now to her her heirs & assigns forever.

I also give & bequeath to my sister Nancy Bell one hundred dollars to her her heirs & assigns forever - I lend to my sister Nancy Bell my Negro Boy Perry during her natural life & at her Decease I give and bequeath him to James Hathaway, Horatio & Hathaway & the child which my sister Angelica is now pregnant with - in case of the death of either the s^r James Horatio, or the said child which my sister states is now pregnant with, for the said Perry to go to the Survivors to them their heirs or assigns forever.

I also give & bequeath to James Hathaway, Horatio & Hathaway & the child which my sister ^(Angelica) is now pregnant with One Hundred dollars to remain in the hands of my sister Mary Bell & to be laid out in clothing & Educating them at her discretion or to remain in her hands, until they arrive at the age of Twenty one Year & in case of her death to leave it with some person she may think proper, to be laid out in the manner they may think proper, either in clothing & Educating them or to retain in their hands until the said James Horatio & the child which my sister Angelica Hathaway is now pregnant, arrive at the age of Twenty one Year, in case of the death of either for it to go to the Survivors.

Lastly.

I give & bequeath to my sister Mary Bell all the rest and Residue of my Property both personal or real including the Place Horatio & William bought for me formerly the property of Elias Bond to her & her heirs and assigns forever she paying all my just debts.

And I hereby nominate, constitute, make and appoint my sister Mary Bell executrix & my friend Horatio & William Executors to this my last Will & Testament revoking all & every other Will or Wills or Testaments heretofore by me made & acknowledge this & this only to be my last. I do witness hereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the ninth day of May anno Domini one thousand eight hundred & twenty two.
