First I give & bequeath unto my brother Evan Sawyer my one half of negro Bay Joseph I also give my brother Evan Sawyer my half of negro woman Lydia & further I also give unto my brother Evan Sawyer all the notes & money that I may have on hand at my death

And I hereby make & ordain my worthy friend and Brother Evan Sawyer executor of this my last Will & Testament in witness whereof I the said James Sawyer have to this my last Will & Testament set my hand & seal the day & Year above written Signed Sealed Published & declared by the said James Sawyer the Testator as his last Will & Testament in the presence of us who were present at the time of Signing & Sealing thereof

Batson Berry In the Name of God Amen I Watson Berry of Camden County & State of North Carolina being of Sound and perfect Mind & Memory do this the 4th month day of March in the Year of our Lord Eighteen hundred & Thirty two make and Establish this my last Will & Testament in Manner & form following that is to say

Item 1st I lend to my beloved wife Susan Berry three pieces of Land during which time she keeps & schools Lydia Gilbert & William by her children which she bore by me or for the term of her natural life then to be Equally Divided between the above named children. I namely one piece of Land purchased of Williams Berry one of Capt Perkins one of Capt Sorkley also one black Girl named Mary to the use of my wife in the same Manner & way as the above Land then to be Equally Divided between the three above named children also my wife to have one years provisions out of my Estate for her & children

Item 2nd I give unto my children which I had by my first wife two pieces of Land adjoining the Plantation on which I live one purchased of Hester Wilson the other of Elijah Staples also I wish all the rest of my Estate sold & after paying all my Just debts to be Equally divided between my wife & all my Lawful Heirs I also nominate & appoint my Good friend William Bartlett my Executor to this my last Will & Testament also I appoint him my Testamental Guardian to all my children that is under age in Testamentary whereof I do set my hand & seal the day & date above written Signed Sealed & acknowledged in the presence of
