Item I give my son Caleb Barnard ten dollars which he already owes me at
this time - also all my carpenters tools - saw planes augurs - chisels & shillies
also I leave my horse and wheel and owned equally between my son
Caleb Barnard & my wife Polly Barnard.

Item I give the bequest unto my daughter Elizabeth Barnard one feather bed &
furniture after the manner but her mother is to have the use of it until
she Elizabeth does marry unless she mother gives her the bed sooner -

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mahala Barnard one feather
bed & furniture but her mother is to have the use of it until Mahala
shall marry - Also I give her Mahala one linen wheel -

Item I give unto my wife Polly Barnard in addition to what I have already
given her one chest her choice one loom & harness, one pot of iron
one Dutch oven one kettle and one copper & one linen wheel to her
her use -

Item I leave all of the remainder part of my property both within doors
and without to be sold after my wife is dead & the amount passing
thence from to gether with all the notes I have on hand after paying all
my just debts to be equally divided between my two daughters Eliza-
beth & Mahala - and I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint
my worthy friend Edeon Cartwright my Executor to this my last
will & Testament, revoking & disannulling all other former wills by
me made - I do here publish seal & declare this my last will
& Testament.

Will James Spence

In the name of God Amen. I James Spence of the County of Camden
State of North Carolina being very weak by bodily infirmity but of perfect
sound disposing mind & memory thanks be to God and calling to mind the
certainty of death do make this my last will & Testament in the following
manner to wit -

Item 1. I give & bequeath to my son Griffith Spence all that piece of land I
bought of Daniel Rhodes containing nine acres more or less - also all the
property I gave him off at the time of going to house keeping to him this
time for ever -

Item 2. I give & bequeath to my son James Spence all that piece of land I bought of some
Eason containing twenty acres more or less also a part of the old plantation adjoining
the Eason tract & beginning in the line of the Eason tract at the road in any
space line then along the road to a cross fence a little this side of meeting house
& nearly opposite a persimmon tree thence along the cross fence and continuing
the same course of the fence to John Spences line thence along John Spences line
to the line of Eason tract thence binding the Eason tract to the place of beginning
being that part of the manor plantation wherein the buildings stand (excepting
thence the use of one third part of the said land to his mother during her
natural life) also one young colt - one two year old heifer - one Beefsteak
and one shot gun to him & his heirs for ever -

Item 3. I give & bequeath to my son Elias Spence that part of the old plantation next
to the Canal being the remainer part of my land beginning at the cross fence
in the line of his brother James Spence thence along his line to John Spences line
thence along John Spences line to the Canal bounds thence binding the Canal bounds
Reddick Hillys line Samuel Proctors line & Cary Spences to the place of beginning
(excepting the use of one third part thereof to his mother during her natural life)
also one Cow & calf one Ewe & Lamb and all the property given off to him
when he went to house keeping to him & his heirs for ever -

Item 4. I give & bequeath to my son Miles Spence one bed & furniture one caudle
one Ewe & Lamb one year old colt named Charley to him & his heirs for ever -

Item 5. I leave to my loving wife Courtney Spence during her natural life the use of one
third part of all the lands given to my two sons James Spence & Elias Spence
one gray horse eight head of cattle eight head of sheep & all the rest of my personal
estate of every kind except the small mare - the balance of my stock sheep
cattle which I leave to be sold by my executor at six months credit for the
purpose of paying my just debts -

Item 6. I give & bequeath to my five daughters Nancy - Milly - Pethen - Annetta -
& Courtney Spence all my personal estate of every kind (the use of

James Spence's Will which I have left to my wife courtney Spence during her life / after the death of then mother - also the residue of the money arising from the sales of the barrel mare and the balance of my stock of sheep & cattle if any after paying my debt to be equally divided between Anne & I have also to them & their heirs forever - I hereby nominate and appoint George Beebe Executor to this my last will & testament revoking all other wills & bequests heretofore made & ratifying this as my last will & testament -

Fourthly - I give and bequeath to my brother Thomas Upton negro Boy Noah at the time he arrives to the age of twenty one years old and it is my desire that my executor hire out S^r Noah until that time - and after paying all my just debts out of said hire the remainder to be paid to S^r Thomas Upton - I likewise give to said Thomas Upton my right to a piece of swamp lying on North river near Edmund Shugart and I do also give S^r Thomas Upton my chest - and I do hereby appoint my brother William Upton sole Executor to this my last will & testament - In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 15th day of November in the year of our Lord 1828.
