In the name of God amen I Rodah Overton of the County of Camden and State of South Carolina being very sick but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God for the same and calling to mind the mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and Testament that is to say - principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul unto the hands of almighty God that gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again By the almighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate wherewith I have pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise & dispose of the same in the following manner and form

Item 1. I give and bequeath to my well beloved Cousin Rebecca Overton one linen wheel and one chest and all my cloths, one flock and coal excepted which I give to my Cousin Margaret Taylor daughter of John Taylor to them and their heirs forever.

Item 2. I give and bequeath to my well beloved Cousin William Taylor all the rest of my property within door and without that is not given away to him and his heirs forever. Also I do constitute make and ordain William Taylor to be my whole and sole Executor to this my last will and Testament and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and annul

all and every other former Testament, will legacy, Bequeath, Executors by me in any wise before named made or Bequeathed ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 8 February 1824

Item 1. I leave the use of all my lands, stock, household and kitchen furniture to my dearly beloved wife Rhoda Standley during her natural life or widowhood after selling enough of my Estate to pay all my Just debts & Lawful expenses such articles as my Executors shall think proper and at her death or marriage or hereafter named.

Item 2. I give & bequeath unto my dearly beloved son Thomas S Standley my

tract of land down the River near Raymonds creek containing by estimation fifty acres to him and his heirs lawfully begotten of his body for ever.

It is further my will that ^{at} my wife Death or marriage the residue of my estate to be sold and equally divided amongst my children John Forbes, Thomas B. Standly, Sarah Standly & Mary Ann Standly to them and their heirs lawfully begotten of their bodies for ever.

It is further my will that if any of my estate should have to be sold for my wife Rhoda Standly support that my Executor should sell a negro.

It is further my will that if my son John Forbes should not have his heirs lawfully begotten of his body or die before he comes to lawfull age that his part should be equally divided amongst the surviving heirs above named.

Last of all I appoint and denominate my faithful friend Silas Forbes and Thomas Standly to be my whole and sole Executors. This 10th day of June 1823.

I Arthur Wright of the County of Camden and State of Maryland, being of perfect mind and memory, sheweth that I give unto God, calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and Ordain this to be my last will and Testament.

Item. I lend the use of all my land together with all my household and kitchen furniture & stock unto my beloved wife Lydia Wright her natural life or widowhood and at her death or marriage as follow.

Item. I give & bequeath unto my beloved son Cornelius Wright a certain part of my land the Eastward end beginning at Malachi Godfrey corner at the mouth of the lane thence running north along the branch to a white oak at Isaac Williams line unto him and his heirs lawfully begotten of his body forever.

Item. I give & bequeath unto my beloved son Willoughby Wright the Westward end of my land beginning at the afo^d lane & running as afo^d to the white oak, it is further my will if the s^d Willoughby Wright should die without an heir lawfully begotten of his body that afo^d land should be equally divided amongst Cornelius Wrights children - If the s^d Willoughby Wright should live to have a lawful heir to him and his heirs lawfully begotten of his body forever.

Item. I give & bequeath unto my Grand daughter Elizabeth Dray on feather bed & gown if she arrive to the age of fifteen years to her and her heirs lawfully begotten of her body forever. It is further my will that if the said Elizabeth Dray should die before she has a lawful heir or arrive to fifteen years that my daughter Lydia Burges children should have the above mentioned property equally divided amongst them.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my Grand daughter Elizabeth Wright one bed & furniture to her and her heirs lawfully begotten of her body forever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my grand son Arthur Wright one bed and furniture & when he is lawfully begotten of his body forever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Lydia Burges after paying off all my just debts & lawful expenses the residue of all my estate both real and personal to her & her heirs lawfully begotten of her body forever.

Last of all I appoint and denominate my beloved and faithful sons Cornelius Wright & Willoughby Wright to be my whole and sole Executors this 14th day of March 1823.
