memory blessed be almighty God for the same do make & publish this my  
last will and Testament in manner & form following (viz)

First. I lend to my daughter Polly Robertson during her life her choice of my  
Feather Beds, one large chest, one Table, all my wooden ware and soap  
her choice of Linen wheels, one large wheel, 1/2 a warping Bar two jugs  
two Panels & one pair of fire Tongs - and it is my will that should the  
said daughter Polly die without further issue that the above property be  
equally between my two sons Tully Robertson and Willoughby Robertson.

Secondly. I give to my son Isaac Heatching one large iron pot.

Thirdly. I give to my daughter Alif Simson one small chest.

Fourthly. I leave my flat irons & chairs to be equally divided between my two daughters  
Alif Simson & Polly Robertson likewise my clothes.

Lastly. It is my will that all the rest of my property be equally divided between  
my two sons Tully and Willoughby Robertson and I do hereby appoint my  
son Tully Robertson sole Executor to this my last will & Testament - In  
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the 2<sup>d</sup> day of October in the  
year of our Lord 1830.

Lastly. After paying all my just debts I give and bequeath the remainder of  
my estate of every description and kind unto Lydia Calpepper to her  
and her heirs for ever. In Witness whereof I the said Nathan Keator  
have hereunto set my hand & seal this thirteenth day of January  
in the year of our Lord 1831.

tract of Land should they be purchased by my Executors hereafter  
named & at her death to go as hereafter given away.

Item 2. I give and bequeath to my son Albert S. Proctor all the will  
I own tract of land lying on Newlegan Creek & all the adjoining  
lands purchased of different persons as it now stands - also the tract  
bought of William B. Shepard together with all the stock of every  
kind farming utensils, tools, implements of husbandry belonging to  
said plantation to him & his heirs for ever.

Item 3. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Ann Elisabeth Proctor the  
haar & lot in Elisabeth City, the cotton Tract of Land near Elisabeth  
City also a tract of Land in Camden County on the East side of the Diamond  
Swamp Canal near the Calpeppa Lock containing one hundred  
& forty five acres more or less to her & her heirs for ever.

Item 4. I give and bequeath unto my son Frank S. Proctor all that tract of
