I Malachi Sanger of the County of Camden and state of North Carolina being sick, but of sound & strong mind and memory and having in mind that it is appointed unto all men to die, and being willing to dispose of my worldly affairs do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say

Item the first I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Susanna Sanger all of my negro my boy March, Jerry, John, Emily, Rose and Lane to her and her heirs forever

Item I also give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Susanna Sanger one tract of land lying in said County bounded on the south and north by the lands of Isaac Lamb and on the north & east by the lands of John Grandy being all of the land which I bought of the

Item. I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Susanna Sanger one tract of land in said county near the Court house being all of the land which I bought of Thomas Bell bounded as follows on the East by the land of Isaac Lamb, on the West by Thomas Gordon & on the North by the main Road & the walking land, to her and her heirs forever.
 Item. I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Susanna Sanger one tract of land lying about one half mile below Camden Coast house on the N. side of the main Road bounded as follows, on the West by the land which belong to the heirs of John Wiley and on the North by the land which formerly belonged to Caleb Phillips and on the East by Joseph Ogden's land & the land of Isaac Lamb it being all of the tract which belonged to John Mackin to have & to hold the same she and her heirs forever.
 Item. I also give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Susanna Sanger a certain tract of land lying in Fifty pound neck bounded as follows, bounded on the West by the land of Mark Apter, on the North by the lands of Henry Aydelitt's heirs, on the East by the lands of Thomas Ethridge and on the South by the land which belong to the heirs of John Greary being by estimation seventeen & three quarters of acres which formerly belonged to the estate of John Mackin to her and her heirs forever.
 Item. I also give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Susanna Sanger after paying of all of my Just debts all the residue of my estate of every kind & nature whatsoever to her and her heirs forever.
 Lastly I hereby nominate and appoint my wife Susanna Sanger whole and sole executrix to this my last Will and Testament bearing all other Wills and Publishing this and this only to be my last Will and Testament - In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this the 30th day of March one thousand eight hundred & twenty four 1824.
