

Item 2^d I give & bequeath unto my Grandson John Sanger the north end of my plantation that is to say from the ditch up to Nehemiah Riggs line and to run from the swamp a straight course to Hollenders Old line being the remainder of my land beside the piece that I have given to my son Stephen Sanger to him this heirs forever, with the exception of my son Mills Sangers life time in the land that I have given unto my grandson John Sanger the son of Mills Sanger and I also give and bequeath unto my son Mills Sanger one Chest to him this heirs forever.

Item 3^d I give and bequeath unto my daughter Polly Sanger one bedstead Furniture, one chest, one Red Table Chest of drawers, One Pins and one Calf that she claims, one pewter dish, one Iron pot, one Loom and harness one Linen wheel to her this heirs forever.

Item 4^d I give and bequeath unto my grandson Amos Sanger one horse to him this heirs forever.

5th Item. I give & bequeath unto my grandson Milton Sanger one bed to him this heirs forever.

6th Item. I give & bequeath unto my grandson Stephen Sanger one bed to him this heirs forever.

7th Item. I give & bequeath unto my grandson William Sanger one heifer and her increase to him this heirs forever.

The remainder of my property not given away I wish my children to divide it equally among themselves, and I hereby make and ordain my son Stephen Sanger executor of this my last will and Testament. In Witness whereof I the said William Sanger have to this my last will & Testament set my hand & seal the day & year above written Signed, Sealed & published by William Sanger the testator as his last will & Testament in the presence of us who were present at the time of signing & sealing thereof.

Item. I leave all the remainder of my estate nothing without to be sold in six months credit and after paying my just debts & the remainder to be equally divided between my five children that is to say Isaac Sandelin & Betsy Sandelin & Caleb Sandelin son of my husband Percy Sandelin dec. to have Polly Sandelin, Melthy Sandelin Britannia Sandelin to have an equal share with my five children as above named.

Lastly I appoint my friend Cornelius Wright my executor to this my last will & Testament disallowing all other before this made & making this to be my last will and Testament - In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the day & year above written. Sealed, signed, published & declared by the testator to be her last will & Testament in presence of us.

Item. I give & bequeath unto my two daughters Melony & Sarah and Daniel Symmes all the residue of my estate within doors & out to be sold & all the proceeds after paying all my just debts to be equally divided between my daughters aforesaid, share & share alike to them & their heirs forever.

Item. Lastly of all I nominate, make and appoint Seth Bell my whole & sole executor to this my last will & Testament entirely disannulling and revoking all other hitherto by me made in any wise, satisfying, confirming & acknowledging this to be my last & true will in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 19th day of May

Carolina being sick in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory [Aspirate God] do this 5th day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand, eight hundred & twenty three, make and publish this my last will & Testament in manner following - that is to say -

Item. I give & bequeath unto my nephew Asa Gibson the Southern part of said plantation adjoining Brittain Jones and others to him & his heirs forever, also one State mustel.

Item. I give & bequeath unto Andalina Melinda and Alexander Gibson all of my lands lying on the great Island to be sold when Alexander Gibson arriving to the age of sixteen years old and the money to be equally divided between them - The said Island to be rented subtenant that period for the support of said children to them & their heirs forever.

Also. It is my desire that all my movable property, indors and out of every kind and crop now growing to be sold, and all of my just debts paid out of the money arising from said sale. If there should be any balance remaining after paying my just debts for it to be equally divided between my sister Nancy Cartwright and Jacob Gibson to them & their heirs forever.

Lastly. I hereby make and ordain my worthy friend Stephen Mercer executor of this my last will & Testament in witness whereof I the said Asa Cartwright have to this my last will & Testament set my hand & seal this day & year above written.
