In the name of God Amen I Dorothy Jones of the County of Camden State of North Carolina being sick but of perfect sound mind and memory thanks be given unto God for the same calling to mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make & ordain this my last will and testament in manner following -

Item I give & bequeath unto my well beloved daughter Nancy Barnham one feather bed & furniture and all my wearing apparel but three pockets which shall be hereafter mentioned to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my well beloved son Ira Jones one feather bed and furniture one hand mill one Rattle one pot trammel one fat pig one small fat cat one tin gallon Jug, three sitting chairs & them and his heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my well beloved son Benjamin Jones one feather bed & furniture one chest one table one loom & harness one linen wheel two iron pots one tea table one spider one fat tub, one soap tub one pair fire Iron one pot trammel one pewter basin one washing tub one water pail one half bushel seven sitting chairs one safe one quart Jug three heads of cattle & all my gear & fowls one pair steel yards all my cooking ware to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my grand daughter Emma one flock to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my grand daughter Sarah Francis Jones one flock to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my grand son Isaac Jones one flock to him & his heirs forever.

I also constitute, make and ordain my beloved son Ira Jones, my whole sole Executor to this my last will & testament to do according to the legacies bequeathed in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the 12 January in the year of our Lord 1830.

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Will Peter Dozier.

In the name of God Amen I Peter Dozier of the State of North Carolina and County of Camden being sound mind & memory blind be God do this the twentieth day January one thousand eight hundred & twenty eight make this my last will & testament in manner following to wit -

Item - I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Patsy Dozier all the negroes I have in my possession at my death that came by her - also the third part of all my land during her natural life.

Item I give & bequeath unto my nephew Edmund Sawyer all of my land after the death of my wife two thirds of the same to be taken in possession immediately after my death to him and his heirs forever also one shot gun.

Item - I give & bequeath unto my nephew Isaac Trask one negro man by the name of Jim to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my brother Enck Trask one negro woman by the name of Lydia to him & his heirs forever also one shot gun.

Item I give & bequeath unto my sister Amelia Dozier one negro man by the name of Sam to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my friend W. B. Webster one negro woman by the name of Phillis to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give unto my brother Enck Trask all of my wearing apparel to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my sister Patsy Trask one black horse to her and her heirs forever. It is my desire that all the residue of my property to be sold & after the payment of my just debts and the residue if any I give unto my beloved wife - Should there not be a sufficiency sold at my vendue to pay my just debts it is my desire that my Executors should sell enough of my wife's negroes to discharge the same.

Lastly I nominate and appoint my loving brother Enck Trask my Executor to this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this day & date above written.
