I give & bequeath unto my friend Jesse McPherson
one negro Woman named Susannah one Boy named
Edison one Boy named Alson one Boy named George
to him & his heirs forever

Fifth

I leave all the Balance of my Estate to be sold
and after all my Lawful debts is paid the Balance
if any to be Equally divided between John Brito
Hyiah Brito & Jesse McPherson to them & their heirs
forever

Sally

I constitute and appoint John M. Brito my whole
and Sole Executor to this my last Will & Testament
to do according to the legacies bequeathed in witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal the 8th
February in the year of our Lord 1834.

harness all my corn & pork two white patches one cow & year-
ling Six head of Sheep first Chace all my hogs one
mare to her & her heirs forever

I give & bequeath to my well beloved daughter Dicy Brito
one feather Bed & furniture one Linnen wheel to her & her heirs
forever

Sixth

I give & bequeath to my well beloved Daughter Denny Brito
one feather Bed & furniture to her & her heirs forever

Seventh

I give & bequeath to my Grand Daughter Margaret Brito one
cow and Lamb to her & her heirs forever

Richard Brito I leave the Remainder of my Estate that is not
 given away to be sold and after my Just debts is
 settled the Balance of my to be equally divided between
 my four least children Vincy Joseph George & Malachi
 to them and their heirs forever.

Also I constitute make & ordain John M. Brito my
 whole and sole Executor to this my last will & Testament
 to do according to the Legacies bequeathed in writing whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this 6th Feby 1832

In the of God arrived I Isaac Harrison son of the County
 of Camden and State of North Carolina on the 10th day
 of Feby A. D. 1834. Being in a low state of health
 though of sound mind & memory thanks be given to
 God for the same to make public & Ordain this my last
 Will & Testament in respect of my worldly estate that it hath
 pleased God to bless me with First of all I Recommend
 my Soul to God who gave it me & my Body to be buried
 in a Christian like manner

I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Lidea Harrison
 two & a half Bells of iron one horse Buda & saddle

one Horse Cart & Harness one Blanket & Harness two pairs of
 silver Head of Hags 1 pair Fire Dogs one Table one pair shoes
 one pair of trousers one Linen white pair Chair one Blanket one coat
 one pair of Harness one Dutch oven one Tea Kettle one Stove all
 the Dautry on the plantation fifty Bunches of corn fifty Bunches
 of wheat fifty Bunches of Sweet Potatoes Also one negro man
 named Lechabal and I also find her one one negro Girl
 named during her natural life & at my wife's death for the said
 negro Girl during to be equally divided between my four Daughters
 Mrs Wm Mary Lydia Sarah & Martha. I also find the use
 of the following Land to my beloved wife Lidea Harrison during
 her natural life (viz) Beginning on the main Road near the old Shop
 thence a westward course to the woods on the wharf Road thence
 along the woods fence a southwardly course by a neck of cleared
 Land that leads to my Martin Wright place thence & along the
 fence various courses to the main Road thence along the said Road
 to the first Station containing all the cleared Land of the plantation
 wherein I now live next said main Road with the Building
 thence with the privilege of fire & wood & Rail Timber from my
 wood Land

I give and bequeath unto my son Morgan Harrison all the
 Lands which I bought of Thomas Roberts up to a ditch
 that runs from Live Wrights widow's line the first ditch upon the
 South Side of a墩ghill wherein Martin Wright formerly lived
 and runs an eastwardly course as the ditch runs until it strikes
 the line of the heirs of Seth Will and then runs eastwardly of
 the main Road which I bought of Matthias Sawyer also one
 negro Boy by the name of Matthias to him & his heirs forever
 Reserving the Land which I lent to my wife during her natural
 life

I give & bequeath to my son Wilson Harrison all the Land
 which I own on the Eastward side of the main Road it
 being bought of Isaac Gufford Jacob Goffney and Samuel
 Bray wife and fifty acres of Swamp that was sold to me
 by John Seymour also one negro Boy named Amos to him and
 his heirs forever

I find to my Grand Daughter Peggy Harrison my River side
 Land & Plantation to be Rented out for her until she arrives
