last will and Testament in manner & form following (viz)

First. I lend to my daughter Polly Robertson during her life her choice of my
Feather Bed, one large chest, one Table, all my wooden ware and soap
her choice of Linen wheels, one large wheel, one warping Bar two jugs
two Panels & one pair of fire Tongs - and it is my will that should the
said daughter Polly die without further issue that the above property be
Equally between my two sons Tully Robertson and Willoughby Robertson.

Secondly. I give to my son carter Hecatching one large iron pot.

Thirdly. I give to my daughter Alif Simson one small chest.

Fourthly. I leave my flat irons & chairs to be equally divided between my two daughters
Alif Simson & Polly Robertson likewise my clothes.

Lastly. It is my will that all the rest of my property be equally divided between
my two sons Tully and Willoughby Robertson and I do hereby appoint my
son Tully Robertson sole Executor to this my last will & Testament - In
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the 3^d day of October in the
year of our Lord 1830.

In the name of God Amen! I Samuel Proctor of the County of
Camden and State of North Carolina being of perfect sound & disposing
mind & memory thanks be to God do dispose of my property which
has pleased God to bless me with in the following manner to wit -
Item 1. I leave to my loving wife Elizabeth Proctor during her natural
life the use of the plantation whereon I now reside & the Peter McIntire
tract of Land should they be purchased by my Executors hereafter
named & at her death to go as hereafter given away.

Item 2. I give and bequeath to my son Albert S. Proctor all the will
I own tract of Land lying on Newlgan Creek & all the adjoining
lands purchased of different persons as it now stands - also the tract
bought of William B. Shepard together with all the stock of every
kind farming utensils, tools, implements of husbandry belonging to
said plantation to him & his heirs for ever.

Item 3. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Ann Elizabeth Proctor the
house & Lot in Elizabeth City, the cotton Tract of Land near Elizabeth
City also a tract of Land in Camden County on the East side of the James
Swamp Canal near the Calpeppa Lock containing one hundred
& forty five acres more or less to her & her heirs for ever.

Item 4. I give and bequeath unto my son Fred S. Proctor all that tract of

Land in the upper part of Pasquotank County wherein Lucy Cheney formerly resided with all the adjoining lands purchased of different persons as it is now connected also one tract of Land I bought of Elizabeth Hamell also all the Park lands to him & his heirs for ever.

Item 5. I give and bequeath unto my son Samuel Proctor the Land & plantation wherein I now live also all the lands I own on the West side of the Canal commencing at Spence's Road & extending up the Canal to the stone dock (called the Culpepper dock) including the lands bought of Alfred McWhorter also the Peter McBride tract of Land should it be hereafter purchased by my Executors upon such terms as I shall hereafter suggest also the mill site on the East side of the Canal near the out fall Lock to him & his heirs for ever.

Item 6. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Lucy Proctor all the Buck Swamp tract of Land near the great Bridge adjoining the lands of Sam^l Sullivan & others to her & her heirs for ever.

Item 7. The foregoing legacies to my five children are to be valued by my Executors hereafter named and the difference to be made up out of my estate so as to make them all equal in point of value.

Item 8. I have all my negroes to be equally divided between my five children to wit Frederick Ann Elizabeth Albert Samuel & Nancy Proctor and my wife Elizabeth Proctor shall share alike and my son Albert Proctor is to have his share of the negroes out of those negroes belonging to the Newbegin Creek Plantation to him & his heirs for ever.

Item 9. I have all my jumper swamp lands together with the Tadmore tract of Land to be sold by my Executors hereafter named at a credit of six, twelve or eighteen months - also all the shingles in the swamp all my stock of every kind & farming utensils, Carts swamp tools, lighters, Crop of corn &c at a credit of six months & money arising from the sales to be equally divided between my five children herein named & my wife shall share alike to them & their heirs for ever.

Item 10. Should my wife have another child to live it is to be made up a legacy out of my personal estate equal in point of value to the legacies bequeathed to my other children including the Lands hereafter given.

Item 11. I give to my son Frederick & Albert I and daughter Ann Elizabeth Proctor two beds & furniture all complete to each of them & their heirs for ever.

Item 12. I give all the residue of house hold & kitchen furniture to my wife Elizabeth Proctor to her & her heirs for ever.

Item 13. I hereby authorize my Executors to contribute and pay to Willie McPherson the one half of expenses of ditching & draining all that tract of Land owned jointly between Willie McPherson & myself lying on the West side of the dismal swamp Canal between the stone lock & the cross canal also to contribute one half of the money to purchase the residue of the lands lying within the limits of the above described Lands so as to make a joint purchase. And further authorize my Executors to purchase the Felipe M^o S^o P^ode tract of Land lying on the Canal whenever it can be bought for the sum of Fifteen Dollars per acre and if such and so go as I have heretofore given it.

Item 14. I give to my daughter Ann Elizabeth Proctor one Tortoise called Pers to her and her heirs for ever.

Item 15. It is hereby directed that in the sale of the Tadmore tract of Land authorized to be sold by my Executors if they cannot obtain the sum of one thousand dollars for the tract to let it remain unsold.

Item 16. Should my wife Elizabeth Proctor have a child to live (as she is now pregnant) I give and bequeath to it all my part of that tract of Land lying between the stone lock and the cross canal owned jointly between Willie McPherson and myself together with what lands I have authorized my Executors to contribute one half of the money for the purchase thereof to him & his heirs for ever - also one tract of Land lying in Virginia on the North West River and the Canal to it and its heirs for ever.

Item 17. I hereby authorize my Executors to sell my house & lot at Deep Creek Virginia provided they can obtain for them the sum of one thousand (dollars) & if that sum cannot be obtained for it to be rented out by my Executors.

I hereby nominate & appoint my friends Thomas Pool of Pasquotank County & Willie McPherson & George Trubee of Camden County Executors to this my last will and Testament revoking all others heretofore made and ratifying this as my last will & Testament. And I hereby constitute & appoint Thomas Pool one of my Executors testamentary Guardian to my three children Frederick I Ann Elizabeth & Albert I Proctor with all the Powers and authority that a Testamentary Guardian can have in the management of their Estates for their benefit. And I hereby nominate and appoint my wife Elizabeth Proctor Testamentary Guardian to my other two children Samuel Proctor & Lucy Proctor with all the Powers & authority that a Testamentary Guardian can have.
