I further leave to Said Hamand Bee all that part of my Manner Plantation that lies west of a certain ditch which runs by a blacke Gum & so on to the woods containing the Buildings after the death of my wife & if Said Haman Should die without an heir I am fully begotten of his Body to fall & decend to Peter Humphris Son of John & Charity Humphris otherwise to him & his heirs forever

All the balance of my Manner plantations I leave to be sold at the death of my wife & the proceeds arising therefrom to be divided between my Sister Charity & Mary & William Geyorge Children of my Sister Sarah so that Charity shall have one half & the other half to be Equally divided between William & Mary

I give & bequeath unto my nephew Samuel Humphris Son of John & Charity Humphris the other half of the Tract of Land that I bought of Abner De Saenger in the Lake adj oining the Land of Joseph Williams & others to him & his heirs forever

I give & bequeath unto my nephews Peter & Malachi Hamphris all that tract of Land I bought of the heirs of Samuel Keaton to be Equally divided between them when they arrive to the age of 21 & untill that period I leave the use of it to John their Father

I further leave to my adopted Son Hamand Bee upsd the piece of Lake Land I bought of Asa Tuttle & if he Should die without an heir I am fully begotten of his body to fall & decend to Malachi Humphris upsd otherwise to him & his heirs forever

I give & bequeath unto my nephew Peter Dugan Son of my Brother Philip & Mary one Son

I do hereby ordain & appoint authorize & empower my Brother Philip Dugan agent & trustee for the especial purpose hereafter named by to hire out my co. Bay Smith & the proceeds of Said hire to be paid over annually to my Sister Betsey Dugan for the Support of herself & Mary Geyorge Daughter of Sister Sarah decd & at the death of my Sister Betsey

I leave my Said Bay Smith to be sold & the proceeds to be equally divided between Said Mary daughter of Sister Sarah & Nancy Geyorge daughter of Sister Betsey to have the heirs forever  
all the balance of my estate of every kind whatsoever both real & personal I give unto my beloved wife after paying all my Lawful debts &c

I do hereby ordain & appoint my beloved wife Executrix to this my Last will & Testament in witness whereof I the Said Isaac Edgins here to this my last will & Testament set my hand & seal Signed Sealed published & declared by the Said Isaac Edgins to be his last will & Testament in presence of us
