In the name of God amen! I Elizabeth Gregory being of sound mind & memory but weak in body hath this day March 3. 1823. made this my last will & testament in the following manner.

First. I do commend my soul to God who gave it me and my body to the earth from whence it came. And as touching such worldly goods as I hath pleased God to bless me with I give in the following manner to wit.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my four sons, Isaac Gregory, Dorris Gregory, Milton B. Gregory and Casin M. Gregory all that land and plantation which I now live to be equally divided between them, share and share alike to them & their heirs.

Item. I give my son Isaac Gregory one Room here called his to him & his heirs forever.

Item. I give & bequeath unto my daughter Dorcas Gregory his chair in the spring chaise now in the colt which she is now with fold with - and I give my son Milton B. Gregory the other after his brother takes his chair in the colt to stay with the mare until I mean at the expense of my estate.

Item. I give my daughter Polly Gilbert one linen wheel that is today the use of it -

Item. I give unto my grand son Franklin Gilbert & Beathie Beut & Permittine one Cow & calf, but her mother to have the use of both.

Item. I give my son Francis Mitchell one looking glass to him and his heirs.

Item. I give my son John Mitchell four bushels of wheat to him & his heirs -

Item. I give my daughter Ann Gregory four bushels wheat to her & her heirs.

Item. I leave all the balance of my estate to be sold by my executors at Private sale, and after paying all my just & lawful debts the balance to be

applied as follows.

First

I give my three children to have a quarter schooling each, and I want my son Isaac Gregory to purchase one & half acres of land for the use of my grand son Franklin Gilbert but his mother to have the use of it her life and the balance to be equally divided between my four sons Isaac Gregory, Casin M. Gregory, Dorris Gregory and Milton B. Gregory share & share alike.

Lastly.

I nominate my son Isaac Gregory & my friend Caleb Perkins my whole & sole executors to this my last will & testament - Signed & sealed in presence of us.

In the name of God amen! I William Sanger of the County of Camden and State of North Carolina being of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be God, do this 14th day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & twenty two make and publish this my last will & testament in manner following that is to say -

1st Item.

I give & bequeath unto my son Stephen Sanger the south end of my plantation, where the house stands that is today, beginning at the swamp side, near a large beech, so as to run straight course to the end of an old ditch, that runs from the Road about one third across the plantation a straight course, and then turn to the west but the line is to be straight from the swamp, with the straight part as it runs from the road so as to make the line straight from the Swamp by running a straight course as the above mentioned ditch to the back line to Hollingsworth's land. One Bed and furniture, one desk, one chair, one table, one Case & bottle, one Iron pot, trammel, one molen wheel, and one Cow & one calf the ones that he claims, one hand mill to him and his heirs forever -

Item 2^d I give & bequeath unto my Grandson John Sanger the north end of my plantation that is to say from the ditch up to Nehemiah Riggs line and to run from the ramp a straight course to Hollands Old line being the remainder of my land beside the piece that I have given to my son Stephen Sanger to him & his heirs forever, with the exception of my son Mills Sangers life time in the land that I have given unto my grandson John Sanger the son of Mills Sanger and I also give and bequeath unto my son Mills Sanger one Chest to him & his heirs forever.

Item 3^d I give and bequeath unto my daughter Polly Sanger one bedward's Furniture, one chest, one red & white Chest of drawers, One Pins and one Calf that she claims, one pewee dish, one Soapstone, one loom and hamp one linen wheel to her & her heirs forever.

Item 4th I give and bequeath unto my grandson Peris Sanger one horse to him & his heirs forever.

5th Item. I give & bequeath unto my grandson Wilson Sanger one bed to him & his heirs forever.

6th Item. I give & bequeath unto my grandson Stephen Sanger one bed to him & his heirs forever.

7th Item. I give & bequeath unto my grandson William Sanger one heifer and her increase to him & his heirs forever.

The remainder of my property not given away I wish my children to divide it equally among themselves, and I hereby make and ordain my son Stephen Sanger executor of this my last will and Testament. In Witness whereof I the said William Sanger have to this my last will & Testament set my hand & seal the day & year above written Signed, sealed & published by declared by the said William Sanger the testator as his last will & Testament in the presence of us who were present at the time of signing & sealing thereof Test. I appoint my friend Cornelius Wright my executor to this my last will & Testament disannulling all other before this made & acknowledging this to be my last will and Testament - In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the day & year above written - Signed, signed, published & declared by the testator to be her last will & Testament in presence of us.
