be disposed of as follows.

To my beloved wife, Eliza Pigott I give
and bequeath during her natural life, all
the estate both real and personal, and of
every kind and description, and all debts
due me, to be used by her for the support
of herself and her children.

My will and desire is that at the death
of my wife Eliza, all the property that may
remain, both real and personal, be equally
divided among all my children and if any
of my children should die before my said
wife, leaving children lawfully begotten of
their body or bodies, that said children
have the portions that would have fallen to
their parents had they been willing.

I do hereby nominate, constitute and
appoint my friend David W. Whitcomb
and my brother Joseph Pigott, executors to this
my last will and testament. In witness

 of Horses I give to my Son Fullan one canoe
 and one cow to my Son Fullan I give to my
 Son Joseph the House he now lives in and one
 cow to my Son Joseph I give to my gran Son
 Stephen the House I now live in and one
 Father bed I give to my gran Son Stephen
 and the furniture I give to my gran Son
 Stephen one gun I give to my Daugh Mirzeian
 one Father Bed and Furniture and one Chest
 and one Hipper to my Daughter Mirzey I
 give to my Daughter Lorry one Hipper
 the rest of my moveable Property to be Equally
 divided between my two Daughters
 I give to my Daughter Mirzeian Fifty acres of
 Land at the Thoroughfare

I give to my Daughter Lorry Fifty acres
 of Land at the Thoroughfare be it none
 I Enjoining this to be my Last Will and Testament
 given and done my hand &c.
