memory do make and ordain this my Last will and Testament
is first I Recommend my soul to god that gave it and my surviving
goods as it has bin pleasure god to bless me with as follows.

Item I give unto my three sons William, Thomas and Wallace all
where I now Live To be Equally divided that is where my son
William Lives to him and where I now live to my son Wallace and
part joining Lawrence Creek to my son Thomas.

Item I give unto my son Joseph one hundred acres of Land on South
joining the Marsh back up and the Rest of my property Land to be equally
divided between my three sons William, Wallace and Thomas.

Item I give unto my well beloved wife the use of the plantation where
Live and all my house hold furniture and stock during her Natural life
and after her decease to be Equally divided between all my children.

Item I give unto my two sons Joseph and Wallace my slaves to be
Equally divided after my decease.

Item I give unto all my daughters Lizzie, Mary and Britty one hundred £
each of 'em my decease.

Item I give to my grand daughter Henry fifty dollars.

Item I give unto my wife Brother son John Williams thirty dollars to be
Laid out by the direction of my Executors for his Education.

Item after my wife decease I leave all my movable property to be
divided between all my Children except what is already given.

Item I further nominate and appoint my well beloved wife and
William and Thomas Robertson my sons my sole Executors to take my
will and testament and in witness hereof I have hereunto set my
hand and put my seal this 1st day of August 1802.

I David Russell of Carteret County, and State of North Carolina, being
weak in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory, thank god
for the same to make and Publish this my Last will and Testament
in Manner and form as follows, that is to say:

Item 1. I give and bequeath unto my beloved Son Nathaniel Russell
one Peice of Land where he now Lives which I got of Wm. Fisher & all
the Lands belonging to me adjoining it, to him and his heirs for ever.

Item 2. I give to my three sons William Russell, Nevill Russell & John
Russell my old plantation where I now Live with all the Lands my
owing, to be Equally Divided between them. I also give to my son John
Russell one Negroe Boy by the name of Alizon. Also one ^{old} bed & Furniture for ever.

Item. I give to Nevill Russell one Negroe Boy by the name of Peter
one Teacher bed & Furniture.

Item I give to my beloved Daughter Elizabeth Russell one Negroe child
by the name of Alice one Teacher bed & Furniture for ever.

Also I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Rebekah Russell one Negroe
girl by the name of Grace, one bed & half, one Teacher bed and furniture.

I leave two Negroe Servt. Lou & her young Child to be
left to pay my debts, also all my property not given away to be sold and
after paying my debts the balance to be Divided among all my Children.

Lastly I do nominate and Appoint my three Sons Nathaniel Russell,
and Nevill Russell and Nevill Russell Executors unto this my Last
will and Testament. Renaming and making some alterations with by
me made, acknowledging this only to be my Last will and Testament,
in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 27
January 1813.
