Allen Roberson of Barlow County, State of North Carolina, being very weak in body, but of perfect mind and memory do make and ordain this my Last will and Testament as follows I Recommend my soul to god that gave it and as for my worldly goods as it has bin please god to bless me with as followeth.

Item I give unto my three sons William, Thomas and Wallace the land where I now Live to be Equally divided that is where my son William lives to him and where I now live to my son Wallace and the part joining Lowes Creek to my son Thomas.

Item I give unto my son Joseph one hundred acres of Land on the joining the Marsh, two up and the Rest of my future Land to be Equally divided between my three sons William, Wallace and Thomas.

Item I give unto my well beloved wife the use of the plantation where I Live and all my house hold furniture and stock during her natural life and after her decease to be Equally divided between all my children.

Item I give unto my two sons Joseph and Wallace my school money to be Equally divided after my decease.

Item I give unto all my daughters Leahy, Mary and Betty one hundred each of my decease.

Item I give to my grand daughter Mary fifty dollars.

Item I give unto my wife Brother son John William thirty dollars to be paid out by the discretion of my Executors for his Education.

Item after my wife decease I leave all my movable property to be Equally divided between all my children except what is already given away.

Item I further nominate and appoint my well beloved wife and William and Thomas Roberson my sons my sole Executors to this my Last will and Testament and in witness hereof I have hereunto set my hand and first my seal this 28th day of August 1806.

I David Russell of Barlow County, and State of North Carolina, being weak in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory, choose to god for the same to make and Publish this my Last will and Testament in Manner and form as follows, that is to say.

Item 1. I Give and bequeath unto my beloved son Nathaniel Russell one Parcel of Land where he now Lives which I got of Wm Fisher & all the Lands belonging to me againing it to him and his heirs for ever.

Item 2. I give to my three sons William Russell, Nathaniel Russell & John Russell, my old plantation where I now Live with all the Lands adjoining, to be Equally divided between them. I also give to my son John Russell one Negro and Boy by the name of Eliza, & one Tractor, Bed & Furniture for ever.

Item 3. I give to Nathaniel Russell one Negro and Boy by the name of Ben or Tractor Bed & Furniture.

Item 4. I give to my Beloved Daughter Elizabeth Russell one Negro and Boy by the name of Alice one Tractor Bed & Furniture for ever.

Also I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Rebekah Russell one Negro and Boy by the name of Grace, one Bed & half, one Tractor Bed and furniture.

I Leave Two Negroes to wit Lue & her young child to be sold to pay my debts, also all my Property not given away to be sold and after paying my debts the balance to be divided amongst all my children.

Lastly I do nominate and appoint my three sons Nathaniel Russell and William Russell and Nathaniel Russell Executors unto this my Last will and Testament. Revoking and making void all other wills by me made, acknowledging this to be my Last will and Testament, in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 27th January 1810.
