I Angelina Guthrie of afore-
said County and State, being of
sound mind, but considering the
uncertainty of my earthly existence
do make and declare this my last
will and testament:

First, My executor hereinafter named
shall give my body a decent burial
and pay all funeral expenses together
with all my just debts out of the
first moneys which may come into
his hands belonging to my estate.

Second, I give and devise to my
wife, Mary Hannah Guthrie, all of
my property both real and personal.
The real estate hereby devised being
Lot Number 15 and part of water lot
Number 251 with the store building
thereon, in Old Town, Beaufort N.C.
But, however, should the aforesaid
Mary Hannah Guthrie die leaving
no heir of her body, then my will
is that all the property aforesaid shall
go to my nearest relatives in proper
distribution according to law.

Third, I hereby constitute and
appoint my friend, William S. Arrington,
my lawful Executor to all intents
and purposes to execute this my
last will and testament according
to the true intent and meaning
of the same and every part and
clause thereof.

Will of Henry J. Willis.

In the name of God.

I do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following—

Item 1st. I give to my beloved wife Mary J. Willis her life estate in my house and plantation and also in my out land; and give her one bed and bed.

Item 2nd. I give to my son, Biers J. Willis a tract of land on the west side of the road that I bought of George D. Lingrich being three acres more or less and also one third of my out land and one bed.

Item 3rd. I give to my son Always J. Willis one half of my plantation I now live upon and one third of my out land and one bed and one half of my farming implements and one half of my house hold and kitchen furniture and my house I now live in.

Item 4th. I give to my son Henry J. Willis one half of my plantation I now live upon and one third of my out land and one bed and one half of my farming implements and one half of my house hold and kitchen furniture and my horse mark and all of the cattle in said mark except two head—these two head of cattle is to be sold to pay my lawful debts.

Item 5th. If either Always J. Willis or Henry J. Willis should die before they become twenty one years old or in possession of his part the other one shall be the lawful owner.

Item 6th. I give to my three sons Biers J. Willis and Always J. Willis and Henry J. Willis my work house and
