 Item 1<sup>st</sup> I give unto my wife Jane Piver the House & lots, my forty acre plantation whereon I now live also all my Hamachs & kitchen furniture and the two water lots adjoining the one I live on to her heirs and assigns for ever  
 Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I give unto my son John Piver one quarter of said plantation old house wherow he now lives to him and his heirs and assigns for ever -  
 Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I give unto my grand son William A. Piver son of Peter thirty two feet front of the east end which my son now lives with the length of said lot back to him his heirs and assigns for ever -  
 Item 4<sup>th</sup> I give unto my grandson Asa Piver the horses and two hennies and my son Richard Piver hennies reserving the present years Rent to delecta granus -  
 Item 5<sup>th</sup> I give unto my two sons Nathan Piver and Elias G. Piver one hundred each

I appoint Sebastian Pigott and Elijah Canada my executors to this my last will & testament under my hand and seal this 9<sup>th</sup> day of January 1836

In the name of God Amen I Benjamin Willis of the County of Carteret and State of North Carolina being in sound mind and memory blessed be god do this 1<sup>st</sup> day of August one thousand Eight hundred and thirty make ordain and publish this my last Will and Testament in the manner following to wit -

I give unto my son Thomas Willis all that part of my land where he now lives being one half of the seventy acres which I bought of James Long just unto him his heirs and assigns forever -  
 I give unto my daughter Sally Willis the other part of my land where I now live declining my House and Plantation it being to other half of the said property across I bought of James Long just unto her heirs his heirs and assigns forever -  
 I give unto my daughter Sally Willis one feather bed and furniture unto her heirs and assigns forever -

I lend unto my son George Willis one feather bed and furniture during his natural life and then after his death I give the said bed and furniture unto my daughter Sally Willis unto her and her heirs -

My will and desire is that my son George Willis to live with my daughter Sally as long as he may think proper to do so -

My will and desire is that hereafter named executors shall sell my right of land that is lying in great rock and for them to make a weight to the purchaser of said land and the money arising from the sale of said lands to be equally divided among my four sons William Thomas, Benjamin, and my son George Willis -

I give unto my grand son Thomas Willis the land of my son Benjamin Willis and Cain and Calf unto him his heirs and assigns forever -  
 My will and desire is that all of my stock horse hennies and Petham furniture and all the rest of my property that is not been before given away should be sold by my executors and the cash I have no hand there be equally divided among all of my children William Thomas, Benjamin, George and my daughter Sally Willis and lastly dividing all other article for me
